**Summary:** (machine translated)

Alpine canyon with high abseiling points and beautiful views over Lake Achensee.

**Hydrology:** (machine translated)

Generally little water. Can be walked well during/after rainfall.

**Access:** (machine translated)

The best place to park is on the north side of Lake Achensee, at the Achenkirch hiking parking lot (47.500, 11.702)

**Approach:** (machine translated)

From the parking lot, follow the signs to the Koglalm (45 min). From there, follow a difficult to recognize path up the ridge (at the beginning still a forest path, thinning out more and more). As soon as you reach flatter and more open terrain (approx. 1600 meters altitude), traverse southwards. If you stay at about this altitude, you will find a small "side gorge" that leads into the Gaisalmklamm (with a lot of scrambling and danger of falling rocks!). The better alternative is to climb another 100 - 200 m further up (at the upper exit of the mountain pines) and then enter from above via the scree slope.

**Tour:** (machine translated)

Many high abseils and beautiful views. The canyon starts very open, but becomes quite incised towards the exit, although it is never extremely narrow. Brittle limestone with old anchors (two new anchors set in 2020, 2024, but take a drill // emergency drill set with you). Some places have to be downclimbed. Alternatively, many anchors are still missing to rappel these places.

**Return:** (machine translated)

A quick dip in the Achensee, then either take the ferry to Scholastika (€9 per trip, 06/24) or take the Mariensteig back north.
