Summary: (machine translated) Very beautiful canyon, deeply cut. Great atmosphere but sandy and murky water. Smaller slides and jumps, mostly rappels. Long access along the course of the river to the first rappel point.		
Hydrology: (machine translated) The first third is quite aquatic, this part can be sporty to uncomfortable with more water. The man-made water drain after the first third of the canyon opens every 5 minutes for 2 minutes, but does not let much more water through even then. After the water drain, the amount of water decreases significantly.		
Access: (machine translated) Park your car in the Kalditsch industrial park (parking spaces at the fork in the road).		
Approach: (machine translated) There is an entry point at an altitude of 750m, see http://www.ctgernstein.com/schluchten/Auerbach . Here you have to walk for a long time in the open streambed until you reach the interesting parts. We therefore recommend the access as described in P. v. Duin's book. To do this, take the abandoned forest path that starts at the north-eastern corner of the Kalditsch industrial estate and descends in a slight left turn for less than 10 minutes. It finally exits before a steep drop. Here we walk horizontally without a path for about 50m to the right and meet a clear path coming from the top right. Follow this down to the river. A few meters above the river still downstream, then we can - carefully - descend into the streambed.		
Tour: (machine translated) 100m downstream from the entry we come to the first rappel (left). A little later the 2nd rappel with the "Progetto" badge. The 3rd and 4th rappels take us to the widening of the stream bed, where the water is drained off. Here, water is drained into the lower course at continuous intervals when the screen at the channel inlet is automatically cleaned. Over the dam down the 5th rappel, a little later the short 6th rappel. Then the 7th rappel to the right of the water-bearing chute (18m). The next short 8th rappel would be a wonderful slide if there weren't some boulders waiting for us in the pool, which is much too shallow. Then a real gorge section begins again. This is followed by rappel 9, the 10th over the rock platform to the left and from there the 11th and 12th down to the bottom of the gorge. There are 2 possible jumps here - after prior inspection. At the exit of the relatively flat gorge bottom we come to the (13th) rappel on the right rock face, a few meters before the waterfall (excess from the water drainage ?) pours down the high wall. The anchor is difficult to reach here, as a slab of rock has apparently "restructured" the belay. There is a bypass to the left. Finally, the exit of the tour is reached and we look for the path and exit to the metal footbridge on the right bank.		

Return: (machine translated)

Turn left at the bridge and go to the lower vehicle parked a little down the road on the righthand side.
