Summary: (machine translated) Gully with a lot of atmosphere, a couple of big waterfalls and quite slippery.		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) Pagomakurre area By the N240 we arrive to Areatza. Iritxin access In the village we take the detour to Gorbea Natural Park, we go up the track to an area prepared for parking called "Larreder". Here we leave the access car. In Areatza we take the BI3530 towards Zulaibar, there we take the detour to the right to Uribe. In Uribe, after a sharp bend to the right there is a track on the left that goes down to the river. After several curves there is a "hairpin" to the right that goes back up to the mountain, we park here.		
Approach: (machine translated) From Larreder we follow a little and soon a track on the left that brings us closer to the headwaters of the river. If we can get here with the car, all the better.		
Tour: (machine translated) Open but very interesting descent. It is a succession of abseilings and skills to save an important unevenness in 1km of route. Much better in rainy weather so that the river carries more water, although it does not usually dry out.		
Return: (machine translated) After the last waterfall, a little further on, there is a path that leads up to the trail.
