Summary: (machine translated)

Remote and rarely used canyon; several sources and tributaries of Hohe First, Riedlbachhöhle, Moosangerlalm, Schotterloch and Freithöfel; slippery limestone; at high water level or rain very dangerous! Emergency exit possible in the middle section; several rappelling points in the watercourse; exposure south; first ascent may have been in the 90s (three old belays) □ 10 new anchors were set in July 2022.

Hydrology:

Access: (machine translated)

approx. 30min

From Salzburg south via the A10 to the exit Golling. Then continue on the B102 (Lammertalstraße) in the direction of Abtenau. At "Voglauerhof" turn left over the Lammer bridge and then immediately left again. Follow the mountain road to the large parking lot at Pichl (47°36'03,00 N, 13°17'55,00 E) where you park your car. From the parking lot at Pichl (by bike or on foot) follow the wide forest road for about 350m in the direction of Postalm until you reach the first bridge that leads over the Aubach (barriers with a driving ban). Cross the stream here and follow the approx. 3.5 km long forest road (small Wiesler-Moserangerl). After some time there is another bridge that leads over the Marchgraben. Then continue along the stream until you reach a prominent junction (sign klein Wiesler-Moserangerl 1,5h). Turn left here and pass the Freithöfelhütte to a small bridge (exit Weiselgraben 818m).

Approach: (machine translated)

ca30min (40min + 30min)

From the bridge (exit/water control) follow the forest road uphill towards Wiesleralm. After a few switchbacks, go straight over a bridge and continue along until you reach a wooden fence. Immediately after the wooden fence you go down another 20Hm through impassable terrain to the stream. Entry at about 1020m.

Tour: (machine translated)

approx. 1-1,5h

The remote Wieslergraben is a lime canyon not deep but in some places narrowly cut with short rappels. Especially in spring or after rainfalls the canyon can become very challenging. Two nice, narrow parts (one in the upper and one in the lower part of the canyon) are interrupted by a rather uninteresting open middle part (where an emergency exit would also be possible). You can't see into the canyon from the trail, so some nice single spots are all the more surprising. The key point is an aquatic 30m rappel (bolts somewhat hidden) in the lower incised part of the canyon. Here the arrival pool is not visible from above (second step possibly slide or jumpable). After that, the canyon opens up and small steps, descents and walking terrain follow until you are back at the bridge at 818m.





Return: (machine translated)

0min or 30min

Get out of the streambed directly at the bridge on the right. Afterwards on the wide forest road approx. 4Km back to the hiking parking lot Pichl/Voglau.
