Summary: (machine translated) A sensational ratio of access and canyoning pleasure.		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) If you are coming from Gap via the R.N. 94, drive past Guillestre and turn left at the end of Saint-Crépin onto the D38, which leads up to Pallon (start of the Canyon de la Biaysse - Gouffre de Gourfouran). If you are coming from Briançon, turn right before La Roche-de-Rame. Follow the departmental road 38B and then the D 238 through the Freissinières valley to the parking lot that marks the exit of the road. Here you will find yourself in the majestic setting of Dormillouse.		
Approach: (machine translated) From the parking lot (which is often crowded in high summer), take the path that crosses the Oules de Freissinières and climb up the G.R. on the right bank of the Torrent de Chichin. At one point, leave the forest and "shoot due north" into the boulder field. Continue in this direction and do not return to the south, which leads to the Oules. You will then reach the village of Dormillouse. At the small wooden bridge, head west again until you reach another small bridge, which is stone and Roman. The tranquillity and beauty of the surroundings should not stop you from getting out your equipment to gear up...		

Tour: (machine translated)

From the Roman bridge, walk 20 m up the stream to the first sill. A first C3 (spits in R.G.) can be jumped over when you see the block hidden under the foam. If the level allows, you can overcome it with a slide. You then pass under a natural millennial arch and can make a jump from a height of 6 meters. After crossing the Roman bridge, you can use the R.G. to get out. This allows a team member to install a zip line from below if you wish.

The canyon then opens up to a more open area or between the sun with small abseils, slides and medium sized jumps (max. 10 m). Be careful with the numerous jumps, where you have to assess the "landing zone" well...

Rappels too close from the water are guaranteed... too far is the knee in the chin...

At the wooden bridge you saw on the ascent, you can take a break and eat by going to the right.

Then you continue with a series of jumps and slides, including the famous "S" slide. Then you come to the most vertical part, where the abseiling sections

This is followed by a fairly long sequence of abseils: C15 + C4 + R7 + C30 + C10 + C40 + C20 + C45... OUF... We have (at the top of this position) 170 m of gas under our feet...

The gear is installed and the only special point of this part is the last 65m abseil, which has to be split. Then one member of the rope team descends to the relay (where there is no room for more than two members) to place the 45m rope for the final rappel.

Commitment

The equipment is very good, the depth of the pools varies from one year to the next.... The slips are before the wooden bridge, then two immediately after on the right. The last two are on the same bank at the top and bottom of the C30.... After that it is ... "atmospheric".

Period/water character

Some years the conditions for a descent will never be there ... This shows how watery this canyon is, which is only very rarely accessible before the exit of August and until the snow arrives.

The history

First ascent by Max Imbert and Henri Vincens.

This route, considered very difficult, offers you the opportunity to navigate canyons in a remarkable alpine scenic setting. At the exit of the FREISSINIERES valley, the Biaysse river flows from the confluence of two torrents that emerge from deep and wild canyons: the Torrent des OULES and the Torrent de CHICHIN. The site at the heart of the PARC NATIONAL des ECRINS is exceptional for its fauna, flora and human environment. Climbing the Torrent de CHICHIN is a serious undertaking reserved for experienced sportsmen. You must be able to assess the risks before embarking on the descent, especially in terms of the speed of the water, as several passages can become traps. If the water spreads across the entire width of the waterfall and forms an almost uninterrupted curtain, the water level is too high. When the cascade splits into clearly separated rivulets, the conditions are most favorable. These conditions are usually present at the exit of the season (end of August, September). Don't forget to stow the equipment in the car.

Once you have stowed the equipment in the car, you can try the excellent raspberry and blueberry tarts in the car at the exit of the parking lot.

DORMILLOUSE, a village inhabited all year round, takes its name from the old French "l'endormie" (the marmot). It is only supplied by helicopter twice a year by the General Council of the Hautes-Alpes. So remember to bring the newspaper or something similar to one of the accommodations ... They will appreciate your gesture...

Return: (machine translated)

At the foot of this very beautiful waterfall, you leave the path to RG on a well-marked path that leads past beautiful wild raspberries.... but "shhhh".

Mais attention : nous connaissons le Chichin comme notre poche et avons dû agir avec une extrême prudence et suivre la ligne de descente en rappel à la lettre pour atteindre le geyser. À partir de la sortie de secours, les rappels suivants se succèdent :MC8 + C30, ensuite, le courant peut être évité en restant sur la rive droite.Nous avons escaladé le C8 suivant sur la rive droite, en passant par la fissure dans la roche et derrière le sapin, afin d'éviter le bassin turbulent en contrebas. Il faut néanmoins traverser le courant, dans une eau qui arrive environ à hauteur des hanches, pour atteindre le point de départ de la main courante.C7 + MC3 + C32, rester impérativement sur la vire supérieure (environ 3 mètres au-dessus du bassin suivant, où se trouve une amarrages chaînée).Descendre ensuite en rappel sur la rive gauche jusqu'au sapin renversé, C25.Juste devant le sapin se trouve une amarrages chaînée).De là, restez toujours sur la crête, C13, derrière un rocher se trouve le prochaine amarrage, aussi chaînée.De là, descendez en rappel jusqu'au surplomb, C18Le geyser lui-même est certes extrêmement impressionnant au niveau d'eau actuel, mais si vous traversez vers la droite orographique après avoir descendu environ 8 mètres en rappel, vous éviterez le jet principal, qui est certainement beaucoup trop puissant actuellement.Voyez photos du 04. Septembre 2025.Au pied de la cascade finale, selon votre position, vous serez au calme et au sec (à droite orographique) ou mouillé et exposé aux rafales (à gauche orographique). Une expérience inoubliable.Le chemin du retour longe d'abord la rive droite au-dessus des haute rochers. Peu avant le début de la prairie, sur la rive gauche, on traverse la rivière à un endroit relativement calme pour trouver dans la prairie le chemin qui mène au parking. Upper parts (above Dormillouse): Impassable, extremely too much water Dormillouse bridge entry: Extremely much water, situation unclear, probably impassable. We entered via the emergency exit. Extremely much water, but with extremely good local knowledge of the Chichin it was feasible for us. To be on the safe side, we bypassed the C8 (before the C35). Extremely impressive with the masses of water in the area of the geyser (final waterfall). Left bank passage between C35 and geyser possible without any problems. Then abseil 10 meters under the
