Summary: (machine translated) Short gorge, usually without water flow, a few rappel.		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) From the BAB 95 (Munich-Garmisch-Partenkirchen) via exit 11 ("Eschenlohe") in eastern direction to Eschenlohe. We cross the B 12 and keep right in the center of Eschenlohe on the Garmischer Straße. We come to a covered bridge over the Loisach, cross the river and then take the Walchenseestraße on the other side half-left. After not quite 300m (from Loisach bridge) we cross the Eschenlaine, which normally has no water flow at this point. After another 300m the road bends in a right angle to SSO. From here another 1100m and we park our car in front of the no driving sign on the right at the edge of the forest.		
Approach: (machine translated) We continue along the forest road and soon come to a fork. Here we turn right in the direction of "Walchensee", "Durchs Eschenlaintal", "Heimgarten". But we take the inconspicuous forest road, which branches off to the far right at this point. On it we come to the gravel bed above the gorge of the Asamklamm.		
Tour: (machine translated) Initially, mainly stretches in the wide gravel bed. Slide brakes are either bypassed (left) or rappelled down. Then the canyon becomes narrow and we move between washed out rock walls and cross some pools. We finally see the footbridge at the top and stand at the exit of the gorge a little later.		
Return: (machine translated) At the exit of the canyons up the path with the stairs on the left. Keeping left we come to the footbridge over the canyons. A few more meters up and then in a northwesterly direction to the paved road. On this road turn right to the car.

We climbed it almost dry and had 3 rappels (2x anchor 1x root), 2 - 3 small jumps and a few small slides. On the "high rappel", as described by the previous speakers, Orog. left (dry) the fixed rope is no longer the best and Orog. right (in the water) the anchor is rather courageously attached. All in all, it's a nice short canyon and really excellent for beginners when there is little water, as it has a bit of everything. In good water, however, isolated pools should not be underestimated! Accessed with a little more water. You can jump the sliding brake at the entry and a few other places. At the high rappel the rope should be renewed but is not yet dangerous as the rappel works normally (machine translated)

Push brake at the entry could be jumped with some ground contact. Otherwise everything is super - some small jumps are doable. At the "high rappel" after the jump in the narrow cut part, only the upper anchor is still there, here you have to be careful with a little more water flow on the edge as you have to stretch quite high over the edge to get to the anchor. We will fix this when we get the chance. (machine translated)
