Forest and crag gorge with low water flow. If, then only worthwhile when there is a lot of water.

Coming from Altenmarkt in the direction of Unterlaussa into the Laussa valley, behind Unterlaussa follow the main road for about 1km until you cross the Teufelsgraben. Parking is possible directly in front of the bridge.

Approach: (machine translated)

We ascended on foot via the path marked in the AMap on the western edge of the canyon. This path is completely dilapidated, difficult to find and takes longer than the actual canyoning tour. It is better to take two cars on the road to Mooshöhe from where forest roads lead to the canyons.

Tour: (machine translated)

In the area below the forest road forest gorge with many blockages and at least one rappel of 30m height. From the tributary on the right, the canyon narrows slightly and you are faced with a 20m waterfall into a large pool. After that, the canyon becomes flatter again: lots of hiking, small slides, mini jumps and a handful of rappels up to a maximum of 12m. The rappels used to be secured with glued anchors, but these are now all completely bent over. However, you can rappel around all the rappels or abseil from natural fixed points. The gorge exits with a 27m rappel from two glued anchors on the right.

The Quengraben, which flows into the Laussa to the west of the Teufelsgraben, is also drilled - access is difficult via a hunting trail on the eastern bank of the gorge.
