Summary: (machine translated)

'Forest canyon for collectors', not secured at the top (rappel from trees or downclimb), then later inadequate securing twice. So who wants to go it, should not forget the drill or setting tool. The pools were regularly too shallow for jumps (2006).

Hydrology:

Access: (machine translated)

Either coming from Munich via Kochel or from the direction of Mittenwald via Wallgau, in each case on the B11 to the village of Walchensee at the reservoir of the same name (approx. 11.5 km from Kochel). Here we head for the Herzogstandbahn with a large (paid) parking lot. Directly south of it is the bridge over the Deinigbach, which we still cross to turn right immediately afterwards into the Dainingsbachweg. Here another 350 m direction SW and then park the car on the right (approx. 830 m above sea level).

Approach: (machine translated)

From the parked vehicle, first walk along the Deiningbach on its orographic right-hand side, first on the road, then on a forest path, finally on the hiking trail up to the Heimgarten summit; the path now leads along the Rotwandgraben, an (orographic) right-hand side stream of the Deiningbach. At around 900 m above sea level, you reach a forest path, which you follow to the right. Two hiking trails branch off to the left, but we stay down to the right and reach the Deiningbach again, which we cross at 930 m above sea level. The trail now climbs steeply on the other side on a hunters path. At around 1140 m above sea level, the path then heads NNW along the slope and leads us up to a forestry administration 'service hut' (1210 m above sea level). 50 meters before reaching the hut, an indistinct path turns left and leads, first slightly downhill, to a ditch (stream), then uphill again to the next ditch, the Deiningbach (1170 m above sea level, entry).

Tour: (machine translated)

Mostly downclimbing, some rappels. The high rappel near the exit is now secured.

Either return to the access path on the right at 930 m above sea level and return to the car in 20 minutes (recommended). Or continue down the stream to a 5 m waterfall; then turn left onto a path that later crosses the stream to the right and finally leads to the forest road of the ascent.

Return: (machine translated)

After the described exits on the approach path back to the car.
