Hydrology: (machine translated)

Must be done with good flow. Spring seems to be the best time.

Access: (machine translated)

From Amondans, take the direction of Lizine(D103). Park at the cross in a hairpin bend or walk to the viewpoint.

Approach: (machine translated)

Directly behind the cross, take a path that leads along a field. Remember that you will arrive at the top left of the field and that the start of the canyon is at the bottom right of the field. Avoid crossing the field. Walk along the edge.

Tour: (machine translated)

A hike through a long, slightly incised corridor with waterfalls and shallow pools. The only obstacles worth mentioning are a 4 m high tufa waterfall that can be de-escalated (steps) and a 20 m long waterfall that flows into a large pool. It is possible to climb up the right-hand side and jump into the same pool, which adds a little life to this descent, which is only suitable for beginners.

A curiosity: in the first part of the descent, a crevasse crosses the stream at right angles, revealing small, shallow caves on either side.

September 2003: At a "natura 2000" meeting, the mayor of Amondans seriously threatened to ban access to the training area in the canyon of Amondans. The reasons for this were the development of professional canyoning and the presence of tags on a tufa waterfall... After a discussion, only the descent to a small tufa waterfall on the left bank was prohibited.

Budding tightrope walkers could walk on a 15 m long, very straight log...

Return: (machine translated)

After the C20, continue through the stream before you come to a very good hiking trail. Follow it for about 10 minutes until you reach the GR. Cross the stream and follow the GR for 100 meters in the direction of the RG. Leave the GR and take a path towards RG, which initially runs along the crest. The ascent is a little steep at the beginning and leads to the starting point.

The description of the access is misleading. We parked further down, next to the Gîte Val-Sainte-Marie (47°03'46.8 "N 6°01'21.3 "E) and walked down to the stream from there. The canyon gradually climbs from the abseil points, making it very beginner-friendly. After the last anchor, you can climb back up on the left on a fixed rope and jump into the pool. Then follow the streambed a little. On the right-hand side there is soon a hiking trail that leads to a bridge over the stream. Shortly after the bridge, a steep path leads back up the road. You then come out at the cross described in the bend in the road (47°03'58.5 "N 6°01'08.8 "E). Anchoring all in order. There are many trees in the stream. (machine translated)
