<b>Summary:</b> (machine translated) Nice canyon for beginners with downclimb and rappel sections. Since the construction of a small power plant due to water scarcity rarely used. Very rewarding after rainfall when there is enough water. An alternative to the neighboring Frauenbach when it (still) has too much water. On sunny days fun for the whole family.		
<b>Hydrology:</b>		
<b>Access:</b> (machine translated) By car from Lienz the main road 100 about 7km in the direction of Oberdrauburg and then on to Lavant. Continue in the direction of the church (on the slope, visible from afar). At the end of the village in the sharp leftward haipin bend (before it goes steeply uphill) there is the first opportunity to check the water level: In the haipin bend stop possibility - Follow the stream a few meters uphill to the power station (assess the water level above (!) the reintroduction). Continue by car along the Kreuzweg to the church of St. Ulrich. At the level of the church on the right parking possibility / WC facility.		
<b>Approach:</b> (machine translated) To the top of the parking lot and then on the forest road 5 min to the first rightward haipin bend. Here is the exit point - climb over the embankment and check the water level. - Continue up the forest road - it gets relatively far away from the canyon. At the third rightward haipin bend, a forest road with little traffic (dash-dotted in ÖK50) branches off to the left in the direction of Auerlingbach. Continue along this road for about 300m until the (small) concrete dam becomes visible in the canyon. Not easy to see through the forest, but it is the first place where you can recognize the stream at all. Here, descend the steep forest in a fall line and in the subsequent flatter terrain keep far to the left and traverse the last steep section down to the stream, which is reached a bit below the dam wall.		
<b>Tour:</b> (machine translated) At the beginning hiking canyon, then alternating downclimb and abseil sections. Protection with bolted iron rings. Usually two next to each other. In the lower third, the rings are missing in one place, but there is an ideal giant pebble with a groove on the uphill side for inserting the rope. Most rappel points are designed so that you can either rappel full in the waterfall or next to it.		
<b>Return:</b> (machine translated) Take the forest road back to the parking lot. Possibly visit the small, newly renovated wooden church on the Gupf above the parking lot. The pilgrimage church of St. Ulrich and the Roman excavations are also worth a visit.
