Summary: (machine translated) Rappel canyon without long running sections, in places a very deep canyon in which the waterfalls gradually increase in depth.		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) By car: Parking lot at the chapel of Meia Legua. With two cars: Drive up to Furna and park directly after the tunnel before entering the village.		
Approach: (machine translated) By car: Walk up the Vereda das Furnas stairway, which offers a great first impression of the waterfalls. When the path flattens out, stay on it for a few more minutes until a small path between a wooden telephone pole and a steel electricity pylon leads down into the cultivated fields. Orientation is somewhat difficult here, depending on the path you choose, you will end up more or less high up in the stream. Ideally, you should start the tour under a large tree with a small downclimb a few meters before the first rappel. (60 min) With two cars: Walk a few meters further towards the village and then descend the stairway and follow it along the houses. Shortly after the last houses are behind you, a small path branches off sharply down to the left between a wooden telephone pole and a steel electricity pylon. See above for the rest. (25 min)		
Tour: (machine translated) It doesn't start very spectacularly with a few small abseils. After the 4th anchor, we find ourselves in a beautiful, deep canyon. At the 8th anchor, the character of the canyon changes again massively: the canyon opens up significantly and we find ourselves in the 85-metre-high cascade of Furnas Canyon. This is rappelled in two lengths. There is limited space for 3 to 4 people at the intermediate belay station. This is followed by a 50 meter waterfall (10m + 40m, there is just enough uncomfortable space for people at the intermediate stand) and a 20 meter waterfall. A little further through the undergrowth and you can see the back of the church.		
Return: (machine translated) Climb up the concrete wall on the right and go behind the church to the car. Behind the church there is a brief feeling of blessing.

Apparently there was a strong flood between April 20th and today. Although the canyon is passable, at least we got down safely, some of the anchors in the narrow area are bent. Two of them are definitely no longer usable. As soon as I have replaced them, I will post this here. It is currently not advisable to climb the route. Access via the stairway on the right bank is still closed. The flood has taken most of the garbage with it. (machine translated)

The high rappels are worthwhile, for anchors see description Mitch. Access is no longer possible as the path is closed, only shuttle by car possible. At the access to the creek it goes from the path through the fields down to the creek. (machine translated)

I can't share the opinion about the glued U-hooks. They look like something from a DIY store or homemade. I cannot estimate how deep they are drilled or whether a thread or similar measures are provided at the back to clamp the glue. Glue has also been used very "sparingly". 2 stands are drilled directly in the waterline and have clear tracks from the rock contact. At the intermediate belay in the 2nd high rappel, a U-anchor "sounds" loose. There was a lot of garbage in the canyon at the top. (machine translated)
