Go to the village of Le Pichoux, then head towards Châtelat and park on the right, just after crossing the torrent.

Reach the watercourse below the bridge.

The descent begins with a small gulch with a C10 (15m descent, AN RG), followed by a C12 (2 very high points RD). This is followed by a series of steps and de-escalation as the stream flows alongside the road (300m, some small slides possible) and you reach the final C20 (2 points RD).

The descent is short and follows the road for much of the way, but it is not necessarily easy riding on the road.

Uninteresting descent as too close to the road!
