With the access vehicle we go back to Guajonye and from there to Tacoronte, just at the entrance we turn right to the parish of Sta Catalina, we will pass by the cemetery and continue straight on Toscas street until a traffic circle where Barranco Martiño street comes out. In this street, after the intersection with the street El Mocán, we park.
