Summary: (machine translated) Conglomerate canyon for rappeling and rappeling (clamps and spreaders). Except for the hall at the end, a tiring "working canyon". Can be well combined with the opposite Cautiecho (see there).		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) From the road Barbastro - Huesca (N 240) about 25 km after Barbastro turn right on the A 1229 direction Abiego, Rodellar. A few hundred meters after Abiego, turn left towards Bierge. A few meters before reaching Bierge, turn right towards Rodellar (Bco. de Mascun). 8 km after this junction, in a slight bend to the left, is the starting point for the access. Under the tree, of which a substantial part has broken off, we park the car. It is the same starting point as for the access to Juncar.		
Approach: (machine translated) We take the track to the north and after the gate we turn right down (SE) to the headwaters of Cueva Cabrito (signpost). Following the existing tracks or pathless, we go through undergrowth to the streambed in Nagelfluh.		
Tour: (machine translated) Conglomerate canyon that becomes increasingly deepened and narrowed. Impressive halls at the end, before reaching the Rio Isuala.		
Return: (machine translated) Upstream the Rio Isuala about 100m, then - before the next swimming passage from the "green strip" up westward (cairns). We meet a trail that goes up the hillside between Juncar and Cueva Cabrito. Before the stable, the track turns south and leads us to a gate and then to the car.
