Summary: (machine translated)

Season: July - November

Pure rappel canyon in clean cold water, very slippery, in the upper part first river walk (first third; if necessary look for alternative entry!) then beautiful canyon with well equipped stands; mostly two bolts (no chain anchors).

Hydrology:

Access: (machine translated)

By car you drive from Radstadt on the main road towards Untertauern, you reach the zoo Untertauern (right side), park the second car here for the subsequent shuttle, then comes the ascent towards Obertauern, (immediately after the view into the canyon, right), follow the road until you turn right before a bridge to the Gnadenalm, park here

Approach: (machine translated)

From the parking lot, follow the signs towards Hakaralm, past some huts, follow the forest road, initially rather flat until it starts to become steep for about 500m after a right-hand bend, then continue along the path towards the forest, you cross a streambed with striking concrete slabs that form a chute, then there is a fork which you follow to the right (slightly downhill), at the next fork after approx. 200m keep left, stay on the forest road, you cross a streambed 3 times until you reach another fork after approx. 1600m, here follow the road to the left uphill, the road climbs slightly until it flattens out after two hairpin bends, follow the road for approx. 600m until you reach a streambed, put on your shoes here and get in.

Tour: (machine translated)

Climb directly into the haipin bend and follow the river for approx. 700m until you reach the first rappel (it is still necessary to cut out or look for an alternative entry!), bindings on the right, watch out for the tree lying across, very slippery, then descend right over two hairpins for approx. 25m until you reach a hairpin bends on the left where you can/must set up a rope bend to reach the next belay (very slippery!), rope traverse to the right onto two hairpins, abseil 25m and descend approx. 25m further to the belay on the left. 25m further down to the belay on the left, nice rappel with subsequent walking passages to the next belay on the left, stepped rappel over very slippery terrain (be careful!), followed by approx. 70m walking passage (keep right rather leave the river) to the next and longest rappel of the tour, belay on the right, after rappel, bolts available for lowering so that you don't have to rappel over the slippery terrain, but you have to look a bit, after downclimbing and walking until you come to the last rappel, belay on the left, be careful with the tree in the fall line.

Return: (machine translated)

After the last rappel, either follow the stream until it flows into the Taurach and then follow the hiking trail back to the zoo or keep left beforehand and through the forest at the height of the power station on the forest road and then the hiking trail back to the zoo and car.
