<b>Summary:</b> (machine translated) Narrow and watery rappel canyon, can change character dramatically from year to year due to mudslides. Long return march in the Furnerbach.		
<b>Hydrology:</b>		
<b>Access:</b> (machine translated) We leave the A13 (St. Gallen-Chur) at exit 14 "Landquart" and take the "28" towards Davos. Almost 15 km after leaving the highway, we turn right to Pragg-Jenaz. Where the Furnerbach reaches this village, we park the car for the exit (see approach in photo gallery).\n\nWith the second car we drive up to Furna and on to Hintersberg (signposted). There we follow the wooden signpost "Alp Lerch". We drive to a road junction where a prohibition sign prevents us from continuing. Here we park the car for access (see realization in photo gallery).\n\n		
<b>Approach:</b> (machine translated) We walk along the road, which is closed to through traffic, for 300m and come to the bridge over the Ronentobel. Here we descend into the stream (entry).		
<b>Tour:</b> (machine translated) A series of rappels in a narrow canyon lies ahead of us. In between, downclimbs are the order of the day. There are also walking passages. There may be a lack of belays in places.		
<b>Return:</b> (machine translated) At the confluence with the Furnerbach, the actual canyoning tour comes to an exit. This is followed by a long walk back down the Furnerbach. At the gravel works, turn right onto the dirt road and continue to the car at the bottom.
