Summary: (machine translated) Approx. 10m deep, pure abseiling gorge with washed-out rock and impressive waterfalls.		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) Drive into the Ötztal valley as far as the village of Espan (after Umhausen, shortly before Längenfeld). Turn right there and park right next to the chapel.		
Approach: (machine translated) From the chapel, walk into the valley, turn left after approx. 200m and walk under the road. Continue straight ahead to the edge of the forest. Turn left there and follow the gravel path to the right after the bridge. A narrow path immediately leads steeply uphill towards the Hemerachalm. At a junction, take the right-hand path, which leads a few meters to the Konerbach stream, where the entry point is (on the other side of the stream you will see a forest path).		
Tour: (machine translated) Well suited as a "practice canyon" (many intermediate stands, very vertical) - nevertheless beautiful and scenically impressive! Stands in good condition (even if one would wish for one or two chain anchors instead of anchors). The highest rappel (45m) is very difficult to pull off! The height indications are all a bit short, especially if you want to go from stand to stand (better take a little more rope with you). In the topographic view from 2011 there are 12 rappels - but currently there is an additional one with approx. 7-10m before the highest rappel, so there are 13 rappels in total.		
Return: (machine translated) Shortly before the bridge, exit to the right and follow the gravel road back to the parking lot.

The altitudes are all a bit tight, especially if you want to go from belaystation to belaystation (better take some more rope). In the topo from 2011 there are 12 rappels - currently, however, before the highest rappel still an additional with about 7-10m, therefore a total of 13 rappels. The parking lot next to the chapel currently does not exist because of construction. (machine translated)
