Summary: (machine translated) Long and surprisingly aquatic hiking, slide and jumping canyon with beautifully washed out and long rocky lanes. Can certainly keep up with the nearby Taglesbach.		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) Coming from Mariazell, ride in the direction of Lunz am See. After crossing the Zellerrain and driving through Neuhaus, there are two steeper descents. Park at the forest road branching off to the left (signs: Holzhüttenboden).		
Approach: (machine translated) Follow the forest road up into the valley. When the forest road meets the stream again in the area of a valley extension entry (you can also walk about 5min further into the valley and enter at the road bridge)		
Tour: (machine translated) The stream flows through beautifully washed-out mini-chutes with countless short slides. The smooth rock (compact limestone) and the large water flow ensure that even slides only 1-2m high are entertaining. But there are also a few slightly higher jumps (max. 3m obligatory). The most striking point is a 6m waterfall into a narrow gap, which can be problematic when there is a lot of water (in this case, it is better to avoid it on the right). \nJust before the exit of the tour, there is a 6m possible jumps into a large, round pool.\nThe gorge ends at a dam with water drainage, after which there are three longer slides. Recommended tour, but the water level must pass - check possible above the dam. The photos were taken at a flow rate of 2.0 m^3/sec at the Lunz am See gauge: https://www.noel.gv.at/wasserstand/#/de/Messstellen/Details/214262/Wasserstand/3Tage . \n2 rappels from tree trunks or individual expansion hooks.		
Return: (machine translated) Through the streambed or via one of the forest roads accompanying the stream back to the car

We did not find a direct descent, so we went down across the field. After the streambed there is a blockage just before 47.795471,15.134842. We were able to make a makeshift rappel at this point. At these coordinates, however, a tree trunk lies diagonally in the water at a jump and you couldn't see how deep the water was through the spray, which is why a jump was out of the question for us. we desperately searched for an abseil hook here, without success. If this were a busy canyon, an anchor would be useful here to avoid the jump. In general, the canyon was very slippery. Only the washed up gravel was easy to stand on. (machine translated)

In our tour little water (after prolonged dry period).We got on just before the bridge, to 2 tour 4 hours. 2x to abseil, 1x in the gap (is enough a 20m rope), if bypassed right, just after the place down from tree rope (50m rope or divide on 2x). 2nd time a 20m rope is also enough. Very slippery rock. 1x to jump cca 3m (in the "Klamm"), otherwise smaller jumps. 6m jump we have not found. Pool was gravelled, jumping not possible. Hooks in good condition. Little used. (machine translated)
