Summary: (machine translated) A short walk at the beginning, followed by nice slides and jumps. Then high but ramped walls in the last third.		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) Drive up the Maggia valley and enter Cevio. Cross the village and continue in the direction of Boschetto. After the bridge, follow the road for 100m-150m. Park in the parking lot.		
Approach: (machine translated) Take the road that leads up to Morella di Sotto and continue until you reach the Valle bridge. This is the starting point.		
Tour: (machine translated) A short walk at the beginning, followed by beautiful slides and jumps. Towards the exit there are large and spectacular waterfalls. The seriousness therefore increases greatly in the second half.		
Return: (machine translated) After the water intake, follow a path to Boschetto. From there, take the road to the parking lot.
