From Flühli, turn left towards Glaubenbielen Pass and follow the signs to Chessiloch. Park at the exit of the road.

Approach:

From the parking lot, head towards Chessiloch, then on towards Stäldili. The path gains height as it runs along the canyon on the right. If you overlook the stream above the inlet, you can reach it by descending as far as possible. It is possible to continue on the path to descend 2-3 more waterfalls into the Seebach, but they are not very interesting and add another hike in the river and 20-30 minutes of approach time. At a clearing at an altitude of 1300 m, descend as best you can to the Seebach.

Tour:

A series of small abseils in a beautiful wide gulch.

Commitment

No obvious loophole, but very short redemption.

Period/water character

Large catchment area, plus there are swamps upstream that act like swims and feed the creek continuously even days after rain. Wait for a dry period before considering the canyon. The equipment available is not optimal for very large volumes of water.

Leave the park at the footbridges and hairpin bends back to the parking lot via the hiking trail.
