Dry canyon, almost a collector's item, with a vertiginous vertical of 50m. Good facilities, not overdressed and with the possibility of combining several canyons in the same day.

**Access:** (machine translated)

From Berga direction Puigcerdà by the C16, passing the swamp we have the detour to the left to St Corneli and St Josep by the BV4025, beautiful road of Berguedà that zigzagging goes up the mountain, between forests, acquiring better and better views over the valley. This area in autumn is simply a marvel of colors.

Access to Bcos Sant Corneli

Before km1 we will arrive at La Consolació, about 200m before we have a little left curve with a track to our left behind and another to the right in front. We park the car to return.

We will continue to Sant Josep with the access vehicle we pass the km3 and after a few meters the detour to the left to St Corneli, we will pass by the museum of the mines and continue along the small road on the left, we leave the viewpoint on the left and 50m later we have a very sharp right curve (Polvorí Vell parking) we make the curve and the counter left curve, a small straight of 100m for another right curve after which we will park.

**Approach:** (machine translated)

Access to Bcos Sant Corneli

From the place where we parked it is obvious, to the southwest looking for the best way to go down to the dry river.

**Tour:** (machine translated)

A first part without anything to approach the vertical, here we will have a first short rappel and then we will see how the cirque opens below us, at which point we have the 50m rappel, be careful when descending there is vegetation at the bottom. We will have one more short rappel and from here on we will be able to descend through areas with a lot of vegetation.

**Return:** (machine translated)

When it starts to open more clearly, without reaching the tracks of the old power plant, we go left to go down diagonally, heading east, always leaving the remains of the power plant on the right, we will stop at the upper tracks and we will leave them until we find one that goes north, here we will go to the road just where we parked.

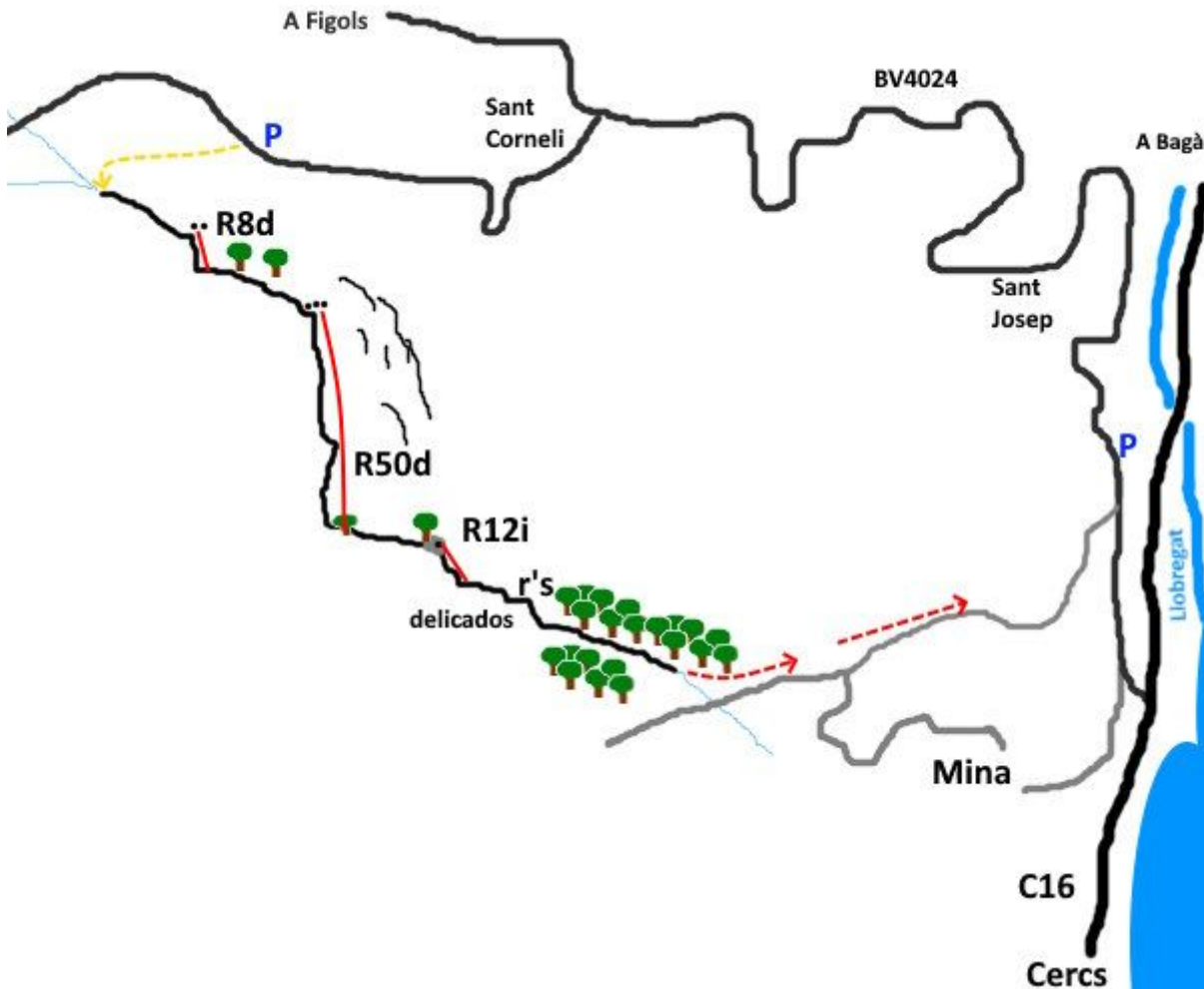
