
















Summary: (machine translated) Basic data		
Hydrology: (machine translated) Recommended after rainfall, otherwise dry. The amount of water normalizes very quickly even after heavy rainfall.		
Access: (machine translated) Approach: North of Trento, park in Zambana vecchia.		
Approach: (machine translated) Parking entry: on foot, take the underpass near the church. Turn left, following the signposts to 680 foigen. Climb up the steep path to a fork at 410 m (Molinel); keep left (signpost Lamar- Val Trementina 681). After this fork we cross a first stream near a fence, a second (Rio della Netta) and the third is ours (Rio Trementina).		
Tour: (machine translated) The slope north of Trento (east side of the Paganella summit) is apparently inaccessible and ugly: in 1955, a landslide destroyed a large part of the village of Zambana and the Zambana-Paganella cable car station. From a canyoning perspective, however, lines and routes can be guessed; after heavy rainfall, the waterfalls gush out everywhere. The Val Trementina begins at an altitude of 1550 m, at the foot of the vertiginous east face of the Paganella, and runs straight down to an altitude of 200 m, north of Trento. Here we suggest the lower part, which is logistically the most impressive. There is a middle section from an altitude of 1000 m, with old but good belays), and an upper section (from an altitude of 1700 m, set up expedition style in 2023) The lower part begins with easy downclimbs. After the third belay, the canyon narrows and becomes steeper. The Netta stream (also drilled in) joins. Continuous waterfalls follow until the end.		
Return: (machine translated) Exit: after the 50 m abseil, turn left into the forest and in 1 minute you are in the open fields. Follow the open path to the left until you reach the small asphalt road that leads to the village.
