Short canyon, small slides and jumps.

Hydrology: (machine translated)

Small, challenging canyon, no escape possible.

Water sports still in the water in the catchment area of remarkable size.

Access: (machine translated)

On leaving Saint-Laurent de Cerdans, turn right onto the road that leads up to the hamlet of Vilaroja and then continue to the Pla Castanyer parking lot.

Or, shorter and with less difference in altitude, via Spain: Albanyà, dirt road (4x4) from Hostal de la Muga, drive through Pincaró and park 2 km after at the farmhouse "els torrents", where the access and return are located.

Attention, this road is closed from June 23 during the summer.

Approach: (machine translated)

Via Spain (35 min.): Take the path that runs between the two Mas dels Torrents farms and follow it to a mountain pass, then descend to a clearing that forms the connection point to the return path described below (altitude 593). At the mountain pass, descend directly to the left or due south to the river.

Access from France is currently not possible!

The canyon begins with a small muffled jump that can be bypassed from the left bank, followed by a small ramp that can be used as a slide (glide) without a pool at the exit.

This is immediately followed by a nice four-meter-high jump into a beautiful reddish pool from the right bank at the height of a monopoint. This obstacle is equipped with a monopoint for those who do not want to make the jump. You can also overcome the obstacle by sliding.

This is followed by a ten-metre-long vertical rappelling route that leads to a small descent point in a conglomerate constriction.

You can then climb down the next ledge in the river, but the most fun and interesting thing to do is to look for a rappelling routes on the left bank at a height, which leads down into a completely dry and aesthetic crevice.

At the exit of the route, a final slide awaits, equipped with a monopoint, for those who want to try their hand at rappel.

Short canyon, but allows for a quick exit in case of thunderstorms.

If the water level is very high during the descent, the canyon is not accessible due to the water level.

- Take an IGN map with you as there are no markings for the way there and back. The walk is a bit long, but the descent is worth it for the purple-red coloring and the amazing shapes of some conglomerate blocks, but also for the symbolic cross-border dimension of the route: the right bank is in Spain, the left in France.

- This French-Spanish river is accessible all year round and is not subject to any special regulations.

Return: (machine translated)

At the exit of the canyon, at the height of the "Area de caça privada" (private hunting area) sign, climb up the right bank on a hunter's path to the mountain pass at an altitude of 593 meters to the ruins of a casot and then descend to the river on a well-marked path.

Cross the Muga just above the canyon exit and climb back up on the same path as the ascent.

In Spain, at altitude 593, take the outward route again (40).
