Summary: (machine translated) Short, beautiful vertical tour with a view of the Zugspitze; several slippery spots; almost all abseiling points are in the water; some sharp edges; well set up; nice little narrow sections; several escape routes; east-facing; often spectators at the last cascade; sedimentary rock		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) Coming from Germany you drive at the old customs office Ehrwald in the direction of the village Ehrwald. After a short distance across the border, there is a large cross and a sewage treatment plant on the right side of the road. Then there is a small bridge that leads over the Loisachbach with a parking lot for about 10 cars directly level with the road. Park here.		
Approach: (machine translated) From the parking lot, cross the nearby bridge. If you want to check the water level briefly, follow the cycle path (gravel) to the right after the bridge for 5 minutes. Then go back to the bridge and follow the asphalt mountain road (no driving) to the left in the direction of "Häselgehralm". After a rightward hairpin bend, the road leads over a bridge (Häselgehrbach). This is followed by a leftward hairpin bend with a cross. From here it is not far until you come more or less straight to the stream. The entry point is at approx. 1090m directly by the wooden beams (bridge) that lead over the Häselgehrbach.		
Tour: (machine translated) Apart from a short walking passage in the upper part, the canyon is very continuous. Depending on the depth of the water, some steps can also be slid or jumped. The canyon is technically not too difficult, but should not be underestimated at higher water levels, as you often have to rappel in the water jet and the rock is usually very slippery. Several small, beautiful washouts/chokepoints and the max. 25m high abseils in combination with the short access are ideal for a casual half-day tour.		
Return: (machine translated) After the last cascade at approx. 970m, follow the cycle path on the right for 5 minutes back to the starting point.

Entry at the bridge. At the lower entry now chain on the tree; makes the rappel comfortable even for an old man. More slippery than I remembered. The final section currently has to be started via the pools, as there was no sling (with eyelet) left on the tree from which you could abseil through - see photo. (machine translated)

The water level has been monitored daily since 26.07. Sometimes massive changes within 12 hours. Approx. 3.90 km² catchment area, due to the constant rain we could not walk on the Häselgehr within a week. Yesterday the water level was high, probably (athletically) doable, today there is already far too much water flowing again and stones are constantly flying down the last waterfall. We were at the final waterfall yesterday and today and stayed there for a while. With a steel cable pulley you can have a lot of fun on the via ferrata and you don't have to do without a 20m rappel with water contact. (machine translated)

Stands in order. Upper part narrowly cut and beautiful. Lower part quite rugged and open with many slippery places and break-off edges.
