Summary: (machine translated) Sequence of many smaller rappels in a continuously narrow and long gorge section		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) Coming from Innsbruck, we leave the A 12 at Zirl onto the B 177 in the direction of Seefeld, Garmisch (D). After about 2 km we leave the B 177 via the Zirl-West exit. This is where the Hochzirler Straße begins, which we follow uphill. After 1.7 km, a forest road joins from the right. Here we can park the lower car in a suitable place. The second car continues uphill, past the Hochzirl train station to the Hochzirl regional hospital (3 km from the B 177). Park the (upper) car on the left-hand side of the road here.		
Approach: (machine translated) From the upper parking lot, we take the forest path that leads directly above the hospital in an easterly direction. Follow the signs to the "Solsteinhaus" here and beyond. If you only have one car available, it is best to park it in the lower parking lot and then walk up the forest path that ends here. After just 300 m, you have the first opportunity to change to the upper access path ("Brunnalm"). After 2 km (from Hochzirler Straße) there is a second option (easy forest path) and after about 3 km a third option (just before crossing the Ehnbach). Follow the signs to the "Solsteinhaus". At an altitude of 1385 m above sea level, we pass the freight elevator to the Solsteinhaus. We continue uphill on a path past a fountain with fresh water. At 1610 m above sea level, we pass a hunting lodge (on the left) and shortly afterwards come to the Soln-Alm (1645 m above sea level - also with a fountain). To the right of the path we now see a fenced-in wooden cross. Directly to the left of this, a path leads down to the stream.		
Tour: (machine translated) After about 100m in the open gravel bed of the Ehnbach stream, the gorge begins. Now follows a long series (about 30) of shorter rappels (mostly outside the beam) until you reach the exit of the first section of the gorge after about 2 hours. Here, if necessary, you can climb steeply up to the slope. The more recommendable variant leads after another hour and 5 not unattractive rappels as well as a longer stretch in the stream bed gravel down to the exit on the crossing piste.		
Return: (machine translated) On the slope always slightly downhill and via the hiking trail past the train station to Hochzirler Straße.

Amazing tour, so beautiful!!! Long walk but not difficult, we did it in 2 hours. canyon is very narrow and I would recommend it for every one. We where in a group of 7 and completed the canyon in 2,5/3 hours. Anchoring most are mono point but very good to spot and some high water anchors aswell. The water at the end was 3x more than the beginning, with high water can be very challenging.

Perfect conditions. Stands fit, sometimes quite high, but something can always be missing, would not go without a drill set. When using the e-bike (start at the PPL below the station) a pleasant, short day tour is possible. It's best to leave the bikes after the railing 200m after the material cable car - this is also where the stream comes up, which you can use to get off after the first part. Beautiful! At lunchtime there is also a bit of sun at the moment... (machine translated)

Access by MTB 50 min + 40 on foot. We only walked the upper part (abseiling points 35 to 6). Exit after the hole on the right up the streambed back to the bike. Water cold and perhaps a little more than usual. We didn't need the auger. At one point we used a Panikexe (highly recommended). Abseiling point 25, the belay is much too high (not easy to reach even with a robber ladder), a glued anchor in good condition looks out to the right at foot level, with good rope management you can easily pull off the rope. A flap has been added to the Abs 23, when pulling the rope I noticed that it is not very tight. Please tighten it. We had a lot of fun 📖 (machine translated)

Scenic, fascinating and extremely rewarding. There is a bolt at belay 23, but there is no bolt and rapid link. However, the spot can be downclimbed without any problems at this water level. An obstruction must have come loose at belay 18. Here the anchor can only be reached via a robber's ladder. Be careful at the blockage at the Gnaupenloch. It is easy to trigger a rockfall here. (machine translated)
