Access: (machine translated)

Leave the A 95 (Munich - Garmisch-Partenkirchen) at the exit Eschenlohe, pass under the railroad line and turn right when you reach the village square in the center of Eschenlohe (T - crossing). After the left turn, head for the covered Loisach bridge, cross the Loisach on it, then follow the Mühlstraße to the right (signpost "Sportplatz"). After 550 m we come to a fork and take Siemensstraße in a southeasterly direction. After another 750 m we come to the sports field and park our car here (690m above sea level).

Approach: (machine translated)

We pass the sports field on the left and do not go down into the gravel bed of the Urlaine, but take the path that goes up the edge of the slope. Later, it goes steeply uphill and we meet a forest road (780m above sea level). The forest path finds its continuation in a hunters path ("only for experienced hikers"). After another 35 minutes we come to an indistinct fork (1020 m above sea level). Here we do not go further right up the ridge towards Zundereck (red dots), but go straight on into the forest. The path goes in a southerly direction, always slightly ascending, and after about half an hour (from the fork) we come to a prominent rock face that rises above the path. Right here we are looking for the somewhat inconspicuous track that branches off to the left down from the previous path. It leads to the Archtal hunting lodge and brings us before to the entry into the Urlaine.\nWho wants it in the access more pithy, takes the old Klammsteig (partly exposed) up to the Archtal hunting lodge and further to the entry (see Google map under Weblinks).

Tour: (machine translated)

A mudflow has cleared the stream, especially also of the many dead wood that used to be found here. On the other hand, it has flattened almost all the anchors except for a few. We made do with 80 meters of ropes and some "emergency operations" on the stands. The highest rappel is only 15 m, but rappelling from trees or rappelling over several steps require more rope. Replacing all the anchors with setting gear makes the tour day-filling and then that would be no glued anchors. So if already, then with drill. More details about our walk on 13.07.2014 can be taken from my extensive video and photos.

Return: (machine translated)

After the final gorge downclimb over boulders, then above the slide brake left out and down to the car.\nVor the final gorge (about at 840m above sea level) you can exit left on the former gorge trail (somewhat hidden).
