Very beautiful canyon with dolomite rocks. Some anchoring still required, drill recommended.

Approach: (machine translated)

Follow the forest path in a south-easterly direction to the "Stalla dei Ronche".

For the upper entry, take the right-hand path at the crossroads and continue past the "Alpe Rocchetta" to the "Tamarin de Cianpestris", built in 2020. Follow the path to the left to the streambed (approx. 1680m; approx. 1.5h)

For the middle entry, take the left path at the crossroads and follow it to the bridge (= exit), then continue on the orographic right side to a crossroads. Follow the right-hand path down to the stream (approx. 1580m; approx. 1h).

For the lower entry, cross the bridge as for the middle entry and then follow a narrow path down to the stream at approx. 1360m.

Tour: (machine translated)

In the upper part are the first places for downclimbing, then it goes under a natural arch, followed by beautiful waterfalls into turquoise, clear pools. A slide of approx. 3-4m (05/2025 possible), also smaller slides.

A longer river walk follows between the upper and middle sections. In the middle section it becomes very incised (few escape routes!). Some downclimbs/river walks. The free-hanging, approx. 30-35m high waterfall is certainly a highlight.

We descended the beautiful Val d'Ortiè on 15 August 2025. We added bolts in the first part (1670m-1575m) in two places (fix and ring), particularly on the first narrow 30m wet waterfall where we didn't actually see any old bolts (there should actually be an R7+R30). However, there is now an exposed L30 (you may need to secure yourself to reach it, as there is no handrail). Further downstream, we used a tree to overcome a few metres of difficult downclimbing. In the second part (1575m-1350m), after a flat section, the gorge gradually narrows with some very beautiful sections. Here, it is generally better equipped in some places (a few double bolts, but usually single, often new). At 1350m, a clear path (R) emerges. We tried to continue (small toboggan), but we did not find any anchors at the next obstacle, and in any case, the gorge is cluttered with many stuck trees! In general, however, some anchors are single with only a plate in the flow (bring some quick links to leave behind) or supplement with anchors to be positioned better or doubled up!

Went in at the upper entry (highly recommended) and out at the alternative/lower entry. Had to reset 3 anchors. 2 slides possible. Water ice cold, but super water level after rainfall! There would still be a few anchors to set (possible via Felsköpfl for the time being), a belay sling in the upper part would have to be replaced. A special feature: in the upper part after the slide, a rock head is currently absolutely necessary for the high rappel to set up a rope traverse to the stand orthographic. right. Water level picture (upper entry) attached. (machine translated)
