Summary: (machine translated) The Taugl is one of the oldest and longest canyons in Austria which used to be partly kayaked; after the first Engklamm follows a beautiful but also very long river walk to the Römerbrücke(road 10km,gorge ca.7km)about 10Km ² large catchment area. Tip: Most canyoneers do only the first very short (ca.30min) beautiful gorge (do not forget your camera!) If only the gorge is walked no shuttle car is necessary. Be aware of weather and water level; in spring and after rain usually too much water; most beautiful sunlight in the morning (about 10-11am).		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) From Hallein in the direction of Bad Vigaun, then continue in the direction of St. Koloman. If you want to go one of the two long variants (whole Taugl or entry via Gmainbach) you need a shuttle car at the Römerbrücke. To do this, turn left about 2km after Bad Vigaun at the sign Kuchl 5km (Römerbrücke) and park directly at the bridge (lower exit point). With the second car you drive back to the main road and up again towards St.Koloman. After the bus stop turn left towards Trattberg (Gasthaus "Sommerau"). For variant 2 (entry via Gmainbach tributary) would be after the inn Sommerau right at the curling rink a parking possibility. For variant 1 (whole Taugl or short gorge), however, continue over the small bridge and then turn left. Follow the Taugelbodenstraße for about 3.9km in the direction of Tauglboden. About 600m before the large gravel parking lot is a yellow hiking sign on the right side of the road with a clear path to the Tauglstrubklamm. Either park immediately after the hiking sign at the turnout on the right side (space for 1-2 cars) or at the large gravel parking place afterwards.		
Approach: (machine translated) Variant 1: Directly opposite the yellow hiking sign, descend into the "Taugelstrubklamm" to the gorge (tree loop or anchor in front of the waterfall) Variant 2: At the curling rink, enter directly into the Gmainbach (! For this variant, 2x50m of ropes are necessary for the last approx.40m waterfall that flows into the Taugl).		
Tour: (machine translated) Variant 1 is a short path from Tauglboden to the worthwhile gorge Engklamm. Here you can either rappel outside the water over a tree loop next to the narrows ca.20m or in the water from the anchor directly at the waterfall --> then no more rope is needed--> it follows a very nice short cut gorge section with smoothly polished limestone (partly pink / reddish color) and small jump / slides partly with fixed ropes . Shortly after the narrow section, the canyon opens. Here you have a left exit possibility to get back to the parking lot in a few minutes. Attention: After the next step it is no longer easy to turn back or exit. A long (approx. 4h) river walk follows to the Römerbrücke bridge, where after the water level measuring point there is another waterfall (can be bypassed) before you get out of the river on the left below the Römerbrücke bridge. Variant 2 has several small rappel (5-10m) interrupted by walking passages in the bedrock until you finally meet the 40m high Gmainbach waterfall which flows into the Taugl (no pitons! only tree slings) -->thereafter follows a long (ca.4h) river walk to the Römerbrücke.		

Return: (machine translated)

At short Taugl variant is the exit just after the gorge. Here left in a short time via forest path up to the parking lot. With the long variants is the exit directly under the Roman bridge. Here immediately left steeply up to the parking lot --> then Schutteln from the lower parking lot to Tauglboden or Gh.Sommerau at the Gmainbach.

The double bolts at the start on the left side are missing hangers!! They are just naked bolts in the rock. We rapped off of a sling around a tree (which we later retrieved). The canyon itself is comparable to the polished sandstone walls we are familiar with in Aus. Quite deeply cut, super cool smooth rolling lips for the water features and deep pools to jump into. Very very worthwhile just to check it out. We only did the primary constriction, and then walked back up to the car. The grade feels a little soft, and I think it could pretty easily get A3.
