Summary: (machine translated)

Vertical canyon, a single rappel with friction and difficult rope management. It is possible to install in fixed and go up with caving techniques.

Beautiful activity of this canyon, an access by conglomerates to this headwaters and the possibility of continuing the canyon by water hiking through the Turmeda (return vehicle in Esplugafreda). To take into account the difficulty to go up under the Rocaespasa de les Comes.

Enviably and wonderful environment for sunny days, winter and spring. Extremely hot in summer. Avoid windy days. Presence of birds of prey in the area, so avoid breeding periods. Fall of stones.

Coma de la Capella Oeste is also open, but requires more rope management, rappel max 110.

Access to Bcos de la Terreta

At p.k. 101, just before the detour to Arén, we have the detour to the right to Orrit and Sapeira. We will have to follow this small road towards Sapeira and Castellet at all times.

Once we get to Sapeira, we must continue straight ahead without entering the village, towards Castellet and just at the exit park.

Approach: (machine translated)

On the right is the path heading east that climbs towards the mountains, before the kilometer cross the ravine Canaril and 300m later crosses it again to start climbing through a pine forest to the ridge that separates this ravine Llepós. Once on the ridge we will follow the path to the peak above Les Comes.

To our left, on the north slope, a beautiful forest towards the Castellet area, to the left the rocks on the conglomerates and cuttings of the descents of Les Comes.

We can continue around this cirque, where our descent is, for a kilometer until just where it ends and begins the next one, Coma Art, to turn south and go down its divide about 200m before turning right (on the left we have Art).

We could also have descended directly down the rocky slope towards the cuttings. Be very careful not to confuse the two possible descents West and East.

The first thing to say is that it is not easy, we have two options, each more interesting:

- * Through the valley of Turmeda (water hiking) to then climb to Esplugafreda (combination of vehicles) or follow a losing path to climb to Sapeira.
- * Under Rocaespasa de les Comes, going up its belts to go to the exhaust channel of Coma Art. Hard climb, difficult but very interesting.
