<b>Summary:</b> (machine translated) Generally dry canyon and therefore not particularly attractive, long running routes with downclimbs on the way in and out.

Access on foot therefore seems more practical, see "Access" below		
<b>Approach:</b> (machine translated) From the parking lot for the exit, continue up the bad slope. When you reach the parking lot for access, turn left at an acute angle. First down the dirt road where the path exits, keeping left to the streambed (entry). Leaving the slope to the left, an inconspicuous path leads upwards, which later reaches the slope again.		
<b>Tour:</b> (machine translated) First we have to walk and downclimb in the dry streambed (over 30 minutes) before we reach the 1st rappel. This is followed by 4 rappels, 2 of which exit in a Marmita Trampa. Both dry pools can be climbed around on the right. This is followed by another 15 to 20 minutes of walking and downclimbing until we find an exit to the left up the bank.		
<b>Return:</b> (machine translated) On the left high bank we descend pathlessly through the bushes parallel to the streambed until we see our car on the left for the exit.
