The first long pool is bypassed on the left slope along a clear path; only then does the trail continue along the riverbed.

There are several paths on the right, in the middle and on the left, marked with red or blue cairns. There are fixed ropes to climb up at the waterfalls. If you like block climbing with a bit of cooling off or want to go without much equipment, this is a nice excursion. Rather not real canyoning. (machine translated)
