Summary: (machine translated)

Short rainy tour with relatively long downclimb passages and loose rock at the beginning. High risk of falling rocks in the canyon.

Hydrology: (machine translated)

Rain tour with, as a rule, little water throughput

Access: (machine translated)

We drive from Niederaudorf in the direction of Brannenburg on the country road. We park the first car at the coordinates of the lower parking lot. Then take the second car in the direction of Tatzelwurm. When we have left the Agg district and are approximately at the height of the apple orchard on the left (before the Humelei), we turn right onto the narrower road towards Bichler See. Here we drive as far as the indicated coordinates of the Wildbarren hiking parking lot.

Approach: (machine translated)

Access variant 1:

One car to the exit and one car to the upper parking lot. From the upper parking lot, follow the forest road to the Felixalm. From there, follow the poorly recognizable path in a north-easterly direction to the entry point.

Access variant 2:

We walk from the lower parking lot in a northerly direction along the forest road until it exits into a dilapidated path in a westerly direction. We follow this path until we finally cross the ditch (emergency exit). From here it is not far to the entry point.

Simply follow the path.

Tour: (machine translated)

The tour starts relatively unattractively with three steeper downclimbs, over loose scree, of about 50m and two rappels over expansion bolts of about 30m. We climb down the next step via the left side before reaching a series of several rappels. These consist of two higher rappels (approx. 25-32m) and several places between 7m and 18m.

Return: (machine translated)

Follow the river bed until you reach a wall in it, where you can also see a forest road and a hunter's stand on the orographic right-hand side.

Alternatively, you can also get off a little further up, as there is still some walking to do below and only a small step to follow. To do this, we exit at the level of the remains of an artificial basin and trees marked with ribbons towards the forest road.
