In the valley of Nevache. Just after the sign for Plampinet, turn right onto a gravel road. Continue to the stream and park at the exit of the road (quite a lot of through traffic).

Or go into Plampinet, turn right before the Auberge de la Clarée, continue to the barrier that blocks the slope from Les Acles and park in the parking lot.

Approach: (machine translated)

15min Only the lower part: Path straight ahead up the slope above the parking lot for about 100 vertical meters without crossing the torrent from the parking lot. Then the path branches off to the right to approach the torrent, which you clearly overlook. There is a spit there that you can rappel down to reach the stream below (approx. 15 m). Now the fun part begins.

45min-1h for the entire route: From the parking lot, it is best to cross the forest on the left to reach the slope. Follow this. 300 m after a bunker, a small, steep path leads over a scree slope down to the streambed.

Tour: (machine translated)

Two unequipped landings must be de-escalated via the RG and then via the RD.

A small slide is used to reach the narrows.

A C6 equipped with RD precedes a second, similar obstacle equipped on both sides.

This is followed by a C3, then a C4 equipped with R.L. before reaching the C13, which is active on the left bank and above water on the other side.

A small ledge of 5 meters that is de-escalated.

Then you come to the part that is the most fun (and practiced). This is where the middle part begins, starting with a T2 and then a T4 (you can ascend thanks to the equipment available). A well-grouped jump is even possible in the R.G. above the slide.

A C5 in a well-cut section can be descended underwater on the R.D. or bridged on the R.G. on a large level. Then you reach the high point of this canyon: C17 (above water in the RG or in the active area on the other side...).

Some small ledges end this beautiful descent.

Narrow canyon, only one way out via a handrail (ropes).

But equipped with high and low water.

The middle, lower section can be completed in 1.5 hours with 2 people.

For the whole parts you have to reckon with 3 hours.

Be aware of the risk of mudslides during summer storms.

Period/water character

Wait until the snow has melted in this beautiful valley (May, June).

The water is consistently cold. We are in the Hautes-Alpes at an altitude of 1500 m.

Avoid rain and thunderstorms (high water + rockfall).

Historical background

In modern technique by A. BACH, M.BRUNELLO, C.CHILLET, P. DROUIN in October 1991.

The first descent is said to have been made in August 1969 by Mr. Laurent Rey (called Brioche) accompanied by his son.

Remarks

Do not park on the track leading up to the Chalet des Acles.

A much-visited canyon, many professionals with their groups in summer...
