Rappel canyon with several complex stands

Hydrology: (machine translated)

Tends to be dry. Generally good amount of water after heavy rains when all other canyons have too much water.

Southern entrance to Fortogna

Approach: (machine translated)

A hiking trail leads up to the canyon

Tour: (machine translated)

Starts with a multi-pitch consisting of a short rappel that is drilled very deep and a medium-high rappel (right around the corner)

Short run, then short rappel from the tree. It is recommended to use a sling/carabiner at the edge.

Rope traverse to the ~70, which has one between.

Short run, rappel from the tree. Some downclimbs and another C15 lead to the final waterfall, for which there is a rope railing point and 2 belays. The belay behind the edge has a better rope run than the upper chain - using the front chain extends the rope requirement to approx. 85 meters!!!

Finally, 10 meters of rope traverse and 25m of rappel on a sharp edge.

With about 100mm of precipitation coming down between Monday and Sunday morning, the flow rate turned out to be good to go down smoothly while pleasantly enjoying a few showers. Weapons OK. The first rappel has the arms at foot height causing a departure practically in full cast, but there are trees to avoid it. N.B. at the third fork in the approach keep right avoiding the left that takes us under the pylons. (machine translated)
