**Summary:** (machine translated)

Generally dry canyon, except during the thawing season or heavy rains, good option if the rest of the area is past. Nice waterfalls if we catch them with water.

**Hydrology:**

**Access:** (machine translated)

On the A21 (Pamplona-Jaca), we will turn off at Sigües (Roncal Valley) onto the A137, after passing the Yesa reservoir. We will continue straight on towards Roncal and as soon as we enter the province of Navarra we will reach Burgui and continue towards Roncal.

After passing the bridge over the Esca, p.k. 21, there is a smooth right curve and a place to park on the left, just in front of our ravine.

**Approach:** (machine translated)

We will go south, pass the bridge and continue 500m to a track that comes out to our right, we take it, climb 100m and in the left curve we leave it aside to climb towards the light turrets. From there following, more or less, the line of the high tension cables we will go to take the cordal up there following the turret.

Already almost at 800m of altitude we will see a small path that takes us towards the riverbed.

**Tour:** (machine translated)

The first part of the route is made up of cliffs and bathtubs that will take us to the most vertical area, where we will find 5 rappels.

The last rappel, the 40m waterfall, can be split with a natural to the left, but there is usually no problem in the recovery of ropes if we do not want to split.

**Return:** (machine translated)

At the bottom we will take the GR southbound, leaving us at the road bridge.
