**Hydrology:** (machine translated)

Very open at the top.

Will be done when the other canyons in the area are not yet open.

Already descended when the starting cirque was still well filled with snow, and no problems in the canyon.

In summer, the amount of water is greatly reduced, even dried up.

However, a thunderstorm in the dominant circus must be dangerous, so don't go in on a stormy summer afternoon.

**Access:** (machine translated)

Cross Benasque on the N260 (A130) and drive up the valley.

200 m after leaving the road leading up to the Cerler ski area on your right, turn left into an empty area from which a path leads across the watercourse. Power station (parking lot).

**Approach:** (machine translated)

A few meters to the left of the power station, a serpentine path begins (beware, it is steeply uphill, but you are in the shade). At the crossroads, turn left and continue uphill to the "Mirador" (spectacular viewpoint). On the right-hand side you can see the valley with the canyon. From the viewpoint, turn right. The path occasionally gets lost on the sloping meadows (be careful not to slip).

Cross a vague tributary and try to descend into the riverbed.

**Tour:** (machine translated)

Very beautiful canyon in the mountains.

The start is open (the first waterfalls may still be under firn, depending on the time of year). Then it becomes narrower, gaining verticality with really surprising obstacles. Depending on the amount of water, you may experience two small "cannonballs".

The view during the entire descent is breathtaking.

Some friction at the start.

Well equipped.

Definitely worth a visit, a very pleasant surprise awaits you.

The meaning of "outdoor activity" comes into its own here.

Don't miss the nearby via ferrata!

**Return:** (machine translated)

After the last (avoidable) abseil point, you can clearly see the path that cuts through the watercourse further down. Descend into the fields and take RG for the way back by car.
