Summary: (machine translated) Steep tour with several, higher rappel. Worthwhile after rains		
Hydrology:		
Access: (machine translated) Exit: From Kranskja Gora, follow road 201 towards Jesenice. After Gozd Martuljek, you will pass two signposted parking lots. About 300m after the second parking lot, you can park just before the bridge over the mostly dry stream. Entry: Follow the road for about 700m, then turn left onto a sand road. Follow this sand road over a hairpin bend, then park on the right just before an overgrown forest path. Space for 3 cars.		
Approach: (machine translated) Follow the overgrown forest path to its exit, then stay on the transverse path. This path is exposed in places but always clearly visible until above the large waterfall. Cross the stream and stay above the rock faces along indistinct tracks until you reach a clear transverse path in the area of a flat saddle. Follow this path to the right to the streambed. Intermediate access. Just before you cross the Strmi ditch for the first time, you can also ascend to the right over a largely pathless ridge until you can cross back into the streambed on the left. You reach the canyon after the first 3 rappels.		

Tour: (machine translated)

After a short walking passages with a small slide, you stand in front of a larger clamping block.

- * 5m rappel from tree stump or rock head on the right
- * 10m rappel or downclimb from anchors on the right
- * 30m rappel over several pools. Anchor on the right

Intermediate entry. Start of a short gorge

- * 10m rappel under a clamping block. Anchor for traverse rope at the back right
- * 6m rappel from anchor left
- * 25m rappel from chain on the right
- * 7m rappel from anchor left

Walking passages with a 10m abseil from sling around root to traverse with access route

- * 6m downclimb in rock channel
- * 5m rappel from tree with sling on the right
- * 15m rappel from 2 anchors on the left under the edge. Fixed ropes available
- * 30m rappel from chain on the right
- * 15m rappel from chain left
- * 60m rappel from chain left, watch out for falling rocks.
- * 35m rappel from anchor right to ledge
- * 35m rappel from anchor left, about 4m below three small trees.

Return: (machine translated)

Cross out on the orographic left slope and descend via a short scree gully. In the area of a high seat begins a hunters path on the left slope that leads back to the car.

Normally this is a dry gorge and only intended as a canyon tour after rainfall. We walked the canyon with outdoor equipment when there was little water. Only splashing water and no lake to swim in. The main waterfall at the end was dry. All anchors in good condition, 2 tree abseils, 1 block abseil, didn't find an anchor point. We had the drill with us, but it wasn't needed. I think this canyon is great even when it's almost dry. (machine translated)
