Rappel canyon in reddish granite. The difficulty here is finding the access.

#### **Hydrology:**

Access: (machine translated)

From the village of Wadi Musa, the starting point for visiting Petra, we drive from the parking lot for visitors to Petra in the direction of Little Petra. After about 3 km we pass through the settlement of Badul and after 5.55 km from our starting point, the visitor parking lot for Petra, we turn off the tar road linls onto a dirt road. It leads into a wide valley framed by mountains with rather vertical walls. The track turns to the west and about 1050m after the turn we come to a small hill, where tracks come from different directions. Here we park our car near two huts and an olive grove.

GPS: 30°21'21.01 "N - 35°26'27.86 "E

#### **Approach:** (machine translated)

We follow the path past the huts, through a hollow and up to a saddle. Then we leave the clear path that goes left towards Petra and keep to the left slope of Wadi Marvan. Passing a single juniper bush on the right. The path is now more clearly visible again. Below the walls of the Jabel-el-Deir mountain we hike down the left edge of the Wadi Marvan. After a while a clear track goes up between the rocks on the left. It leads to the highest attraction of Petra, the "monastery" of Deir.

We descend further to the right at this point, cross a cirque and climb up on indistinct tracks to a jagged shoulder. From here we can see the upper reaches of the Wadi Musa. We now descend below the rock wall until we can descend to the streambed on the right.

GPS entry: 30°20'7.18 "N - 35°25'36.05 "E

## Tour: (machine translated)

6 to 7 rappel, max. 30m. First a small step, then the highest rappel. After a few more rappels, a large rock blocks the way further. The pool in front of the siphon is mostly covered with garbage. A massive branch leaning on the right side allowed us to climb over the clamping block twice. Then run until Wadi Marvan comes down from the right.

GPS exit: 30°20'34.70 "N - 35°25'10.97 "E

**Return:** (machine translated)

We climb up the Wadi Marvan following an indistinct path. From the right (orographic. left) a side wadi enters. We follow the tracks that serpentine up the orographic left slope of Wadi Marwan. At the top we meet our approach trail and follow it back to the car.

For climbers (3./4. degree) there is the possibility to climb back to the entry in or at the edge of the canyon, cf: Walking in Jordan. Walks, treks, caves, climbs, canyons. Di Taylor, Tony Howard, H.M. Queen, 2001 (Route 101) and Jordan - Walk, Treks, Caves, Climbs & Canyons. Di Taylor - Tonny Howard, 2008 (2nd A.) - No. 88
