Summary: (machine translated)

Little known canyon and very entertaining if we do it with water. In summer it dries out and the marmitas remain with stagnant water. It is a good place to start for its simple rappels and fun slides and water skills. The access is a bit long and not very clear.

Hydrology:

Access: (machine translated)

We are located on the N260 between Castejon de Sos and Pont de Suert.

At km 356.5 next to Montanuy, we have the detour for the A1605 to Bonansa and Roda de Isábena.

We will continue until pk 37 where we turn off to Beranuy and Morens. Soon we turn left to Morens where we will park.

Approach: (machine translated)

At the left turn to enter Morens begins a forest track in front and a few meters further a path to the right that zigzags steeply up the mountainside. We will climb about 150m up this path with magnificent views of the valley and find a fork that we take to the right. We will follow this path that at first goes south until it enters the valley of Padierno and then goes uphill to the east. The trail will be approaching the stream until we see where to access.

Tour: (machine translated)

Slides, abseils and 9 rappels of up to 15m to enjoy a good descent with water.

Return: (machine translated)

We can leave the ravine when we reach the GR or a little before by a fairly blurred path. Once on the GR we will go to the right, heading north until we find the access road to Morens.
