Nice canyon although overdressed and with a jungle return, this makes many consider it a collector's ravine. It is better to do it after rains.

The return is by the Grande river so we could use the neoprene or a warm day.

**Hydrology:**

**Access:** (machine translated)

We must get to Yunquera, for this, if we go from Marbella we take the A355 to Ojen. We pass this village and when we get to Monda we turn left towards Guaro on the A7100. Until the junction with the A366 to Alozaina. If we are coming from Malaga we must take the A357 towards Cártama, until we reach Zalea where we take the A354. We will follow it until Alozaina. Once in Alozaina we continue on the A366 to Yuqueras.

When we reach the village we will see the detour to the left to the Rio Grande, we will go down that road to the river bridge, here we turn left and continue to the factory of the light of San Pascual.

If we would like to save a few minutes of return, from the hill, with the return car, instead of going down to the Central we can go down the track on the left, which will be our return, about 1.5kms to a crossroads where we can park to one side.

**Approach:** (machine translated)

Along the track, GR, parallel to the a. de Zarzalones, it is almost 3 kilometers until we reach some sharp bends with the canal on our left. We will see a small dam, site of the first rapell.

**Tour:** (machine translated)

Short, with a couple of interesting rappels.

**Return:** (machine translated)

We will go up about 100m from the Grande river to exit to the right to a track that takes us up to the track where we can park. If we have not left a vehicle here, we will have to walk up to the hill and go down to the power station.

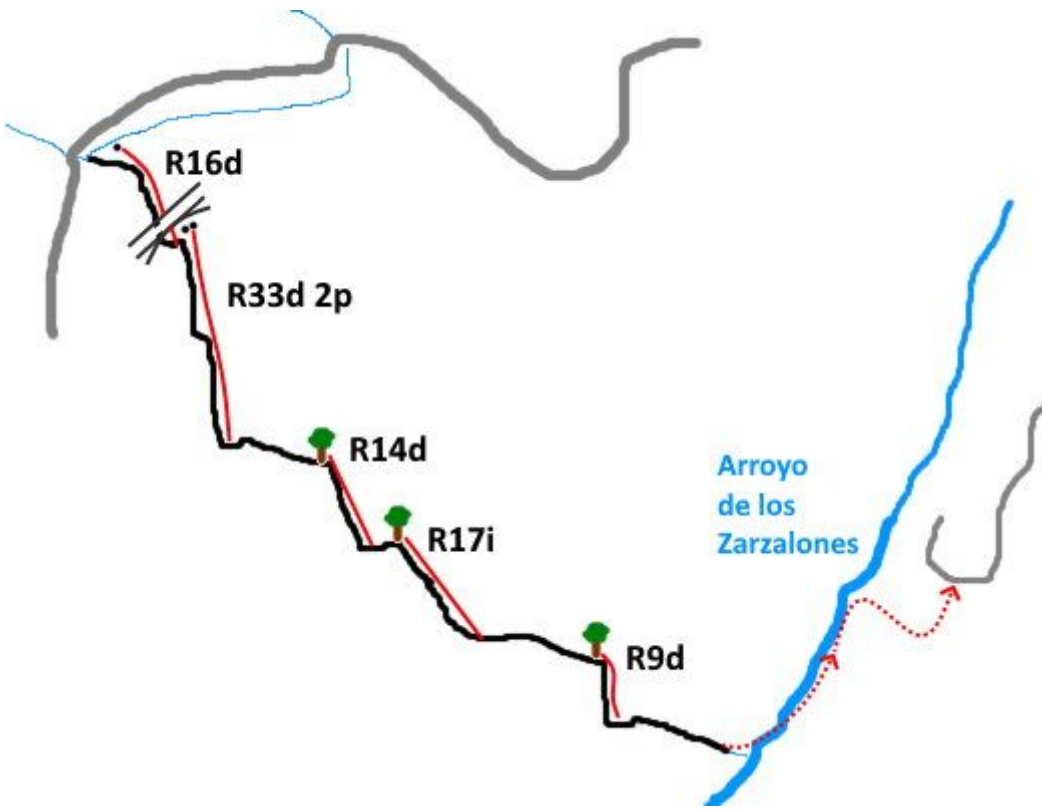
It seems that there is another option, to continue along the river a little more to go out to a path on the left, paved, that we would go up to the access track.
