Acceso: (traducción alternativa) From the village of Rodellar, park at the Mascun campsite.		
Acceso: (traducción alternativa) From the village of Rodellar take the footpath to the stream (Mascun) --> follow the stream upstream until you see the signpost 'Nassare' --> cross the stream to the left --> follow the path --> open area with further signpost 'Nassare' (right) --> long rock face --> follow the path over the high plateau to the next signpost --> to the left. ri. 'Nassare' --> follow the path until the village (small group of houses) Nassare becomes visible after approx. 2h --> pass it on the right --> after the village keep left at the fork in the path --> now descend through thorn bushes to the stream (depending on your pace another 30min-1h) --> follow the stream on the left bank to the entry point.		

Recorrido: (traducción alternativa)

When you arrive at the entry point, you immediately see gigantic, smoothly polished limestone slabs in the course of the stream --> a second tributary comes from the right --> one of the most beautiful canyoning tours in the Pyrenees begins right past the Steinmandl --> countless washed-out and smoothly polished pools with crystal-clear water follow in the upper third, which can be jumped, climbed around or swum through --> the gorge narrows continuously in the upper third --> you can't get out of amazement here because you can see so many different shaped rock formations and pools --> the entire gorge narrows continuously. in the upper third --> in the upper third the canyon narrows continuously --> here you can't stop being amazed as you can see so many different shaped rock formations and pools --> the rock is very slippery throughout the canyon --> most of the slides that look like they are more suitable for jumping or climbing --> the canyons are very narrow --> you can't stop being amazed as you can't stop being amazed as you can see so many different shaped rock formations and pools --> the rock is very slippery throughout the canyon --> most of the slides that look like they are more suitable for jumping or climbing --> the canyons are very slippery downclimbing --> the canyon is wide enough everywhere to be able to move easily --> at midday there is a beautiful incidence of light --> in the places where a jump is questionable, there is always the possibility of downclimbing --> several times there are large rock labyrinths which can be climbed around at the top or bottom --> the canyon can be climbed around the top or downclimbing around the bottom. from the middle section the canyon opens up again --> the grandiose scenic with the many beautiful places remains until the end --> don't forget that the canyon is very long and there is no emergency exit, therefore jumps should always be judged well --> once you have left the middle section behind you, the canyon narrows again --> longer walking and swimming sections alternate --> the final section extends over several 100m --> here you move almost exclusively in open, sunny terrain (streambed) --> at the final section of the Gorgas Negras there is a swimming section after which you find yourself on open terrain with a visible path (right.) and high narrow trees --> from here the following 'Garanta Barrasil' begins --> the red rock on the left side is clearly visible here --> the Garanta Barrasil is used by a lot of people --> the canyon is not so long, but also has very beautiful parts --> in the Garanta Barrasil you don't need a rope, but still have enough strength reserves to climb the next approx. 2-3h walking and climbing --> at the end of the 2nd canyon there is a beautiful 300m long swimming section --> after a short walking passages (right) you are in front of the stone bridge at the campsite.

The way back is via the steep campsite access road up to the road and on to Rodellar (approx. 1.5 km, approx. 45 min.)
