Resumen: (traducción alternativa) rappel canyon		
Hidrología:		
Acceso: (traducción alternativa) (From Belluno) on the A 27 first towards Longarone, then continue on the SS 51 towards Cortina always up Piave. Past Ospitale di Cadore and through Rivalgo, the SS 51 changes after the hamlet of Macchietto to the eastern bank of the Piave. Here immediately turn right and head south through a small industrial area (Ansogne). At its end, park the car for the exit. With the second car, return to the SS 51 and head again towards Cortina. After the following long tunnel, take the next exit to the village of Caralte. From the center of the village take the road leading southeast to the cemetery. Park your second car there.		
Acceso: (traducción alternativa) From the cemetery, we follow Sentiero 365, which leads up to Cima Montagna (1333 m). However, we don't have to go that far up, but follow the path from the saddle (1250 m above sea level), which is sometimes difficult to recognize, down to the entry into the Val di Cima Montagna - a sense of direction is required on the descent. Or follow trail 365 until it crosses the streambed at around 1400m. The start is mostly dry and not bolted (>natural anchor or bypass). First anchor at approx. 1250 m (as of 2022)		
Recorrido: (traducción alternativa) Attractive descent dominated by a 75 m cascade right at the start. This is divided into approx. 35m / 40m (as of 2022). The information does not include a subsequent ascent of the Valmontina (see description there). If you want to continue through the Valmontina, the water flow there should be critically examined (if necessary from the footbridge over the Bosco Bello).		
Regreso: (traducción alternativa) Either continue through Valmontina (see description there) or just before the exit of Val di Bosco Bello (at the large rock overhang and the wire rope) turn left out, then right to the footbridge and on the path "Percorso Escursionistico" (first up and then) down to the parking lot.

Further to the exploration of the upper Cima Montagna at 1400m, we added abalakovs, some (used) quicklinks, and anchor for the highest drop, max. 30m. There is no need to exit the canyon, all drops are covered. Further down we added a couple M10 anchors, but still some downclimbing and many single 8mm. To be completed. With Bosco Bello + Valmontina feels like 4 canyons from dry to big pools, and boulderhopping in between. Approach 1h45-2h30 on excellent trail 365.

Today we climbed Cima Montagna - Bosco Bello - Valmontina. Did not descend at 1270m as described but continued up to 1400m until you can see the streambed directly. Here you have to descend the dry streambed until you can't go any further and then descend orthographic right for another 100m. The entry to the upper part is at around 1200 m, where you can hear water for the first time and where a rich underground spring flows into the previously dry canyon. The ascent, including the descent to 1200, takes about 2 hours. The upper part is a beautiful open canyon with some nice narrow passages. The upper part is almost entirely equipped with rings and 8mm bolts. It would be a pity to skip the upper part because otherwise you descend 300m when you turn off at 1270 and actually miss most of the cima montagna. Bosco Bello was wonderful white limestone blue pools just super. The canyon is really beautiful in the sun. If you don't want to do Valmontina, as soon as you see the bridge over the Bosco ello you have to go up orthographic left and must not rappel any further, the last 3 steps in the Boscobello! If you go up here orthographic left you can also check the water of the Valmontina. Valmontina is an aquatic great canyon with few narrow sections or dangerous passages. In total, we needed 5 hours for the 3 parts. We can't agree with the description of bad stands. There are many single rings with 8mm bolts in the upper Cima Montagna. The high spots are all equipped with 2 rings with 10mm bolts. (traducción alternativa)

Walk in to the top top1.45hrs, descent from top to middle entry 3hrs, ( really bad quality anchors and bad canyon) lower entry to exit track above Montana, 1 hr, walk back to town (ansogna) 50 mins. Montana had a lot of water. Looked cool though. Considering the walk in and out was very long and the canyon was not very good, and the bolts were bad or absent in many places, would not recommend this trip to anyone

We entered on top at around 1400m. by following the 365 trail. We did not find any equipment in this upper part and descended from natural anchors (left some fixed rope, but not everywhere...) first part was dry. Feels like we did 4 canyons in one day. Unfortunately many abseils are equipped below standard with single 8mm :( (traducción alternativa)
