Résumé: (traduction alternative) Beautifully washed out, very cold marble gorge (Hochstegen limestone marble) below the Hintertux Glacier. A diversion tunnel - Tuxbachbeileitung - diverts most of the water from the large Kunerbach stream into the Schlegeis reservoir located in the next valley incision. This diversion can be switched by means of a so-called desander system in the event of debris inflow - even a small amount may suffice - in which case the entire Kunerbach would flow at least temporarily through the Hintertuxbach. I quote from www.alpinesicherheit.com/canyoning from 26.09.2013: "A deadly flood must be expected at any time, as the automatic flushing systems of the canyons are located above the canyon!"		
Hydrologie:		
Accès: (traduction alternative) From the A 12 (Kufstein - Innsbruck) we turn off at Jenbach onto the federal road 169 into the Zillertal. After 31 km we reach Mayrhofen, drive past the village on the 169 and a little later turn off onto the L 6 in the direction of Finkenberg, Lanersbach,Hintertux - 18.5 km to Hintertux. A good km further and we reach the large parking lot of the Gletscherbahn. At the southwest end of this parking lot we park our vehicle near the road bridge over the Breitenbach coming down from the west.		
Approche: (traduction alternative) We cross the aforementioned bridge, walk along the dirt road on the right above the valley station and head towards the now visible final waterfalls of the Hintertuxbach stream. Initially on the orographic left-hand side of the stream, we follow the climbing tracks upwards, soon cross the stream to the other side and have several opportunities to look down into the gorge. About halfway up (after a good 15 minutes) we see a bridge over the stream on the righthand side. You can now continue on this side of the stream on the AV trail 526 (towards Spannagelhaus) to turn right at 1760m above sea level onto a path that leads to the stream and crosses it on a concrete bridge. Entry is directly above over the wide gravel bed. However, it is better to cross this wooden bridge again at about half the ascent distance to the western edge of the gorge. Here, the route leads pathlessly across a meadow up to the clearly recognizable path that runs up from the bottom right. This takes us to the water drainage for the small power station at the bottom of the valley. You can start here (1700m above sea level) if you only want to walk the attractive lower parts of the stream. Otherwise, continue along the path until you can see the wide gravel bed and the waterfalls cascading over it (entry at the northern exit of this gravel bed).		

Tour: (traduction alternative)

First in the upper relatively open and not unattractive parts with some smaller rappels down to the water drainage.

Here entry into the gorge with many rappels. The anchors are mostly set up for rappels outside the beam. The grain of the rock inspires us just as much as its erosion. One rappel exits in front of a 1.5m diameter hole in the rock (forced passage). There are repeated (emergency) exits via iron clamps. Towards the exit of the tour, you cross under the mighty cover plate of the screw cave. There are several descent options here.

Back out in the open, we reach the final waterfalls. Do not descend to the left here, but follow the water arm to the right again to an attractive narrow passage that exits at the level house (after a narrow slip).

Retour: (traduction alternative)

From the gauge house in the direction of SSW up to the path and on it back to the parking lot.

We also walked the short upper part, which starts below the water diversion at the (upper) small bridge, and goes to the private hydroelectric power station. The upper part (about 30min) includes only minor rappels, is flat and nothing special. From the lower bridge, the gorge then becomes very spectacular and insanely beautiful! We have 2 stands (Niro rings) re-drilled, a chain stand of it was no longer accessible. At the end, when it becomes more open, we have kept and right, because then are still beautiful abseiling places. The glacier water is logically extremely cold, you should put on a lot of neoprene! 2 pairs of socks and neoprene gloves. Automatic water drainage usually no problem in the fall in the best weather. 2 emergency exits (at bridge and rather at the end one more). (traduction alternative)
