Steep abseil gorge in an alpine setting - highest rappel: 2x80m

The Gesäusebundesstrasse between Hieflau and Admont to the large parking lot at the Kummerbrücke, starting point for the waterfall trail to the Hesshütte.

Approche: (traduction alternative)

Follow the marked waterfall path to the Hesshütte. After the last insurance, follow the path for about 5 minutes until just before the Ebersangerbach. Just before this, you can descend/rappel through steep but fairly easy forest terrain into the rocky basin above the waterfalls. Aim for the large larch tree on the edge of the wall to the left of the stream. Can be combined with a visit to the Hess hut (walking time from entry approx. 1 hour).

Tour: (traduction alternative)

Orographic tour description:

- * 1-2 tree abseils approx. 15m over ledges and ledges to the large larch tree
- * From the large larch rappel 30m into the bottom of the gorge.
- * Stand to the left of the waterfall (1 bolt+rapid link+ring) 25m.
- * Gravelly walking terrain 50m, best to descend orographic right of the stream.
- * Stand behind boulder next to stream on the right (Bolt-Rapid) 35m (Can be bypassed, up to here escape possibilities on the left). You can also rappel 20m and then rappel 10m from one of the trees orographic right of the stream.
- * Stand on the right in an alcove directly next to the stream (Bolt+Rapid) 50m.
- * Stand left (Bolt+Rapid) 20m.
- * Bolt+Rapid orographic right 6m to the actual edge
- * Stand left at the edge (chain anchor) 100m exactly to the bottom. (3 intermediate stands, each after 30 or 50 m and 65m left)

The belay after 30m is a chain anchor on a fairly comfortable ledge with enough space for 3 people, slightly offset to the left.

At 50m, there are two stands in the fall line from the top stand that look pretty worn out. From the intermediate belay at 30m you could reach a slightly better belay in a small rock niche.

After 65m there is another new hanging belay on two bolts, quite damp if there is water.

- * 80 m walk.
- * Stand on the right (bolt+sling+ring) 10 m (possibly take new reepschnur)
- * 10m walk.
- * Stand left (bolt+sling+ring) 10m .
- * Downclimb two steps, stance left not found.
- * Stand left (1x bolt with fixed carabiner, 1x bolt with ring) 80m to the waterfall path. After 15m there is a new anchor with rapid on the left directly on the edge. Very wet when the water is flowing, room for 1 person.

Sharp edge after 15m, take rope protectors with you

Retour: (traduction alternative)

The last high waterfall exits directly at the hiking trail, which you follow back to the parking lot.

Wild, confusing tour that you should have done. Due to the thunderstorms of the previous days, we had a good water level in the canyon. The rock in the watercourse was very slippery. Great views from the gorge. The only thing missing now is the Quellenschlucht I would still go in with 2x80m ropes. At the last waterfall you could double the new anchor or set up an intermediate belay a little above, but then you would also have to move the top anchor. (traduction alternative)

The access is strenuous, especially as you should have quite a lot of ropes with you for the tour. Nevertheless, it is a really beautiful and rewarding hike through the Gesäuse with good rope protection. The descent into the tour is difficult to find and really steep and brittle, unfortunately we didn't quite find the right way down so we missed the first 2 abseiling points. Lots of bolts as described at the positions and in good condition. Unfortunately, some were damaged or no longer there. But everything that was broken or no longer there was replaced or re-drilled by us. (+ also drilled new holes in a few places to be able to pull off the rope better) so the canyon is now really in good condition again and everything can be done with a 70m rope, possibly even with 60m. * Stand left at the edge (chain anchor) 100m exactly to the bottom. (2 intermediate stands, depending on 30 or 50 m left. Advisable if there is a lot of water, otherwise the ropes are difficult to pull off). Both intermediate stands are present, but the one at 50m is no longer in good condition, so I drilled a new one at approx. 65m. (2Bolts+Rapid) * Stand Left (Bolt+Sling+Ring) 10m (Possibly take new rope) * Stand left (Bolt) 15 m flat to the edge (I did not find it but it is also climbable) * Stand left (chain anchor) 80m to the waterfall path (after overhang possible intermediate stand, difficult to reach) ATTENTION!!! The ropes cannot be pulled off the intermediate belay and it is really difficult to reach, extremely slippery and sloping at the farthest point of the transition. That's why I drilled a new intermediate belay at about 15m directly in front of the overhang on the edge to the left (Bolt+Rapid) From there you can easily get down with a 70m rope, possibly even with 60m and the rope can be pulled off really well from there (traduction alternative)
