Impressive ravine in spring, with good flow, in its first part. In its second part it is better to abandon it and look for the path of ascent. If we do it out of the rainy season it will be dry and will not have too much interest. We will have to make sure to bring material since it is a canyon that few people do.

Avoid winter!

There would be the possibility of making a combination of cars if they allowed us to go up the Cebollar trail.

**Hydrologie:**

**Accès:** (traduction alternative)

By the N260 we will have to go to Broto where we will turn off towards Torla (Ordesa Park).

After the village we have the campsite and Hotel Ordesa on the left side of the road. We park the vehicle here.

If we have two vehicles and they allow us to go up the track, we must go to Fragen and take the track that goes up to Cebollar. We will park shortly before reaching the junction with the ravine.

**Approche:** (traduction alternative)

PR-HU 134 of the FAM that brings us closer to the head of the mountain.

From the Hotel Ordesa, from the back, the PR-HU 134 trail goes up to the Cebollar, this path cuts the ravine.

**Tour:** (traduction alternative)

Its first part is impressive with good flow, beautiful waterfalls and a magnificent R45 almost flown that will leave us wanting more. Then the canyon loses entity and becomes a succession of projections and a small rappel without more.

**Retour:** (traduction alternative)

After the last rappel it is better to go to the right to find the path up, it is a fairly wooded and closed area but you can go forward taking advantage of traces of trails.

The other option is to continue to the hermitage of San Antón.
