Résumé: (traduction alternative) A very beautiful, but also very challenging tour with some thrills.		
Hydrologie:		
Accès: (traduction alternative) In L'Argentière-la-Bessée, head towards Valorise, then Pelvoux, Ailefroide and finally Pré de Madame Carle, where you park (parking lot at the exit of the valley). Beware, the road closes in Ailefroide at the first big snowfall (and then closes in Pelvoux when the snow is lower), in which case you can forget about the canyon, as there are still miles of access road...).		
Approche: (traduction alternative) Take the path that leads up to the Refuges du Glacier Blanc and des Ecrins until it crosses the torrent with or without a footbridge.		

Tour: (traduction alternative)

The creek narrows very quickly and the watered waterfalls follow each other quickly with nice water passages. When you come out of the inlet, 2/3 of the way through the canyon, you have the choice of continuing in a more chaotic area (part 2) or crossing RD to reach a side gully and descending it (part 2b).

Part 1: Almost a dozen abseils and very nice narrow sections.

Part 2: A big block chaos with 5 or 6 abseils.

Part 2b: well-formed chute (part already descended by one group, to be described for the next...).

Strong effort in the first two 1/3.

Possible escape at the exit of part 1 in the RD via a tributary.

Time period/ water character

Too much water during snowmelt and summer.

Ice in winter, with the best season being fall before the big cold snaps.

Above it is the largest south-facing glacier in the region.

The amount of water can double from 8 to 12, even in the fall.

Geology

Complicated.

Gneiss-like crystalline rocks, actually anatexites, disturbed by a bundle of N-S fractures that run through the Pic de Neige Cordier higher up.

Historical background

Already largely developed.

Remarks

Extremely slippery in the water, the rock is covered with lichen comparable to ice!!!

Canyon in the Ecrins National Park.

Light equipment (one point).

Do not over-equip and remain discreet and environmentally friendly.

Report: lolo and RV.

Retour: (traduction alternative)

At the exit of the chaos you reach the glacier plain, then cross the path and reach the parking lot.

A very beautiful, but also very challenging tour with some thrills. Located below the white glacier, the water is correspondingly fresh - gloves and a hood are obligatory. The canyon offers a very beautiful view. The vertical drop is no more than 25 meters, but the destination is not always visible from above. There are a few stretches of walking, some of which are strenuous over scree and gravel. Some of the anchor points are in very poor condition. We did not find the intermediate exit. (traduction alternative)
