| Résumé: (traduction alternative) A short, sunny canyon suitable for beginners with beautiful diving and sliding pools. | | |

| Accès: (traduction alternative) Take the SP1 to San Francesco. Park in the Selenz district (parking spaces in the center of the village and a little further upstream near the bridge over the Rio Marin) | | |
| Approche: (traduction alternative) Opposite the parking lot, follow hiking trail 827 along an initially asphalted forest road over two hairpin bends to a small saddle, then descend to the right along hiking trail 840 into the Rio Scluson valley. Cross the bridge and over the flat gravel bed to the exit of the first part of the tour. On the other bank, ascend easily in rocky terrain with several hairpin bends, crossing a ditch. When you see the streambed of the Rio Sclusons again on a shoulder, descend briefly without a path. | | |
| Tour: (traduction alternative) After a few blocks, a low gorge begins in the bedrock. C 8m rappel from anchor right, jump and slide into a hanging pool C 12m rappel from anchor right, small pool probably jump/slideable C 10m rappel from anchor right, jumpable from rock tower left C 9m rappel from anchor right A block chaos follows, the highest step is defused by an anchor on the left - C 15m rappel After a short hike, you stand in front of the waterfall that you have already seen in the ascent. C 10m anchor left, possibly jumpable 2m jump, repeatable. Hiking trail crosses. You can exit the tour here and return to the parking lot via the access path (15min) Alternatively, follow the stream for 15 minutes to a final gorge with some downclimbs, and a C2 of anchors on the right, a jump and a wonderful rock channel with transparent, turquoise water. | | |
| Retour: (traduction alternative) A bit after the gorge, a path crosses the stream, either on this path to the right to the road (slight uphill section) or 15min through the streambed to the road bridge. Before the bridge turn orographic right to the road. | | |
