Résumé: (traduction alternative) The Edelbach is a karstic rappel and hiking canyon, often visited by avalanches, and is mainly fed by the Stablsee lake and a cave. In terms of water, you have to pass through the stream a few times, where you can expect to find niches and holes. The two large narrow sections (middle and end) are compulsory and have no emergency exit. There are few slides and no jumps. Avalanche wood and rock chaos have to be downclimbed. In terms of ropes, only a lowered structure and possibly rope traverses were necessary. The emergency exits are all steep and grassy. Avalanche debris remains in the stream until midsummer. An interesting combination of cave and stream is now possible. The abseil station is approx. 5m orographically to the right below the cave entrance. The cave, which always carries water, is approx. 60m long with a small waterfall. (Do not forget your Hirabira (headlamp))		
Hydrologie:		
Accès: (traduction alternative) Tirol-Lechtal-Elmen. In Elmen, park at the parking lot for the Stablalm, leave the main road at Elmen in the Lechtal valley and drive to the huge parking lot in front of the waterfall.		
Approche: (traduction alternative) Follow the steep hiking trail up to the Stablalm and straight ahead on the road to the entry. If you want to enter the cave, you have to descend at the gravel patch to a small fir tree with a square block (approx. 10-15m before the first drop. The branches cover the anchor.		
Tour: (traduction alternative) Level: At the first belaystation, the Edelbächlein stream on the left may only splash weakly over the rocky outcrop. Note: If the first narrow section is just fine, then it is better to get out at the next emergency exit. If necessary, set up the rope traverses to the abseil stands yourself.		
Retour: (traduction alternative) Back to the parking lot in 200m

We chose to make the entry on a steep meadow, but we would probably also go a little further up and then down over the snow. (We adjusted the canyon starting coordinates, since they only covered about 1/4 of the actual route.) We didn't find the cave at the top. Right in the middle, there was a spectacular dark snow cave about 200 m long; here, we used body belays. The water level was quite challenging, but definitely manageable. (traduction alternative)
